11. **Reports from Officers – Town Manager Update** – Peter Brixius asked if everyone had the sales tax information which was added. He reported to the council that the sales tax of 71,000 we received this month was a substantial increase from the previous month's receipts. This report represented June sales which were at the same level at this time of year receipted in 2015 but was ahead of 2016. That month was probably impacted by the Chevron project and other events including Hang Gliding going. The Fall CML District Meeting RSVP needed by September 1, 2017, so if you would like to attend please let Teresa know. Budget calendars for 2018 are in your packet which shows our schedule for reviewing the budget this fall. Supervisors are already working on their operational budgets. We have two work sessions planned in September and we can extend that out into October if necessary. We passed out worksheets and data for review, we have asked supervisors to trim up to 10% out of each of their operational budgets. They are working on capital projects along with expenses and will complete by the end of August. On Sept. 7th we have invited the mayor of Craig John Ponikvar, to present Thirteen Ways to Kill Your Community. The event will be held in the high school auditorium and the public is

invited. John Ponikvar is a very good speaker and the presentation will be September 7th at 6:30 at the Rangely Junior Senior High. Our post certification candidate will start classes in August and finish in December. He will come back to Rangely for FTO training for three to four months and will be a probationary patrol officer for a full year after his P.O.S.T. He has a five-year agreement with the Town of Rangely. The water line replacement on Stanolind to the batch plant will start next week. The Trap Club project is underway we discovered we will have to go another 500 feet to complete the line to the North to get some additional pressure. This will be a two-day project once we complete the locates, and will be another \$800 in pipe. Manhole renovations will commence the first week of September. Traffic will be managed on nine different manholes that will be under renovation. The Town Hall remodel is starting show serious progress. Sheetrock, doors, windows and floors are underway. Exterior improvements will commence in 2 weeks. The AV (audio visual) is also being worked out between the state and our contractor. The audio will be paid for by the state, since they do not require visual, we will be responsible for the video recording. Better Cities will be here this week filming components of the community video. Jocelyn Mullen will be participating with river and mountain biking activities. They are going to also film CNCC Dental Hygiene, the Aviation Program and some of their other programs. There is a 3 day schedule of the different scenes that will be filmed that you can review in your packet. Andy Key noted that the schedule they have was a week old so more shots have been planned. We also have a facilitation event planned in September similar to the one at the rec center prior this year, but he does not have a date. There will be some round tables about economic development. Peter shared an email from small business development that will host an event in Rifle that will present some of the resources they have available. Peter will want to attend the event because he believes it will be beneficial for Rangely and the RDA/RDC. Andy Key said that the Small business event will be on September 21st, from 5:30-9:00 at the Rangely Junior/Senior High.. Lastly Senator Bennet introduced legislation for expanding opportunities for coal communities which was released by AGNC today. Everyone should take a look at the bill, it is encouraging as written. We are one of the communities in the impacted zone so we would be eligible for assistance if it were to pass. Peter asked if anyone had questions on projects in Town. Andy Key asked questions about why the state has to pay for the Stop Light replacement when a private individual took out the light. Peter said that because the value of the light is paid at the depreciated value so they do not expect to receive more than \$20,000 for the light as has been CDOTs experience in the past. Joe thanked Peter for his updates.
