## **GAS DEPARTMENT – SUBMITTED BY KELLI NEIBERGER**

### **Project status/Current Issues:**

- *Meter Reading, get reads off large meters, go over reports and meter proof, make corrections, reprogram meters, final meter proof, recheck proof after gas rate calculated*
- *Gas usages and rate for May*

- *Periodic Meter Changes have been completed on residential meters. We still have a few larger commercial meters to change out*

- *Begin leak survey on Section 5 of Town. The Town is divided up into 5 sections and each year one section is leak surveyed. This way, each structure with a gas line (and the gas main) is leak surveyed once every 5 years which is required by the PUC.*
- *Cathodic Protection testing - 10% of services that have anode attached risers*
- *Install anodes where necessary*
- *Periodic monitoring of Border Station particularly with wet weather and odorant injection rate issues (which appear to be solved)*
- *Non-payment shut-offs (started with 12 and 4 customers were shut off)*

- *Annual Highway clean up (both sides of the road from turn off to Columbine Park to Kennedy Dr. and up Kennedy Dr. to CNCC turn off)*

- Kindergarten class took a field trip to the Gas Department to learn about natural gas and calling 8-1-1 before digging
  - CIRSA sent a third party to do a valuation of the Town's buildings and structures. This had not been done for some time, so it was long overdue. CIRSA carries the Town's property/casualty insurance so a proper valuation of our assets was needed.
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## Water/Wastewater – Submitted by Donald Reed

### Project status/Current Issues:

#### Water Treatment Plant:

- Plant operations for May 2019 were good, the average flow is at 580K per day this will start to rise at a more rapid rate during June. Overall operations are changing more frequently due to run off from rain in which we had a total accumulation of 1.86" in the lower elevations, operators must pay more attention on the day to day operations. River intake is currently at 12.98' and rising. Current snow pack is over 100%.
- The Department is working on our project list with several projects under way and progressing.
- There were several operational and equipment malfunctions that had to be corrected or repaired during the Month. Received new Stream and Current Meter and installed. Finished installing clear well drain pipe to end of the lower level entrance.
- Now that we have finalized the warranty issue with the Water Plants rake arm, we have drafted an agreement and are having the Town's attorney look it over for before forwarding to Wes-Tech and Mueller Construction. Will be scheduling the replacement in the fall after high demand period is over.
- Currently as all may know the White river is high at this time, and with run off not at full flow it is anticipated that they may not be any problem with filamentous algae in July or August as we normally see each year but most likely will have it in the latter months of the year.
- Utilities Master Plan – Should be completed by the mid July. This Dept. is working in depth on upgrading this plan to include the Gas Dept. and Storm water systems. This project is a very time-consuming process and will be the most extensive plan ever completed for the town. In its completion it will show a very clear path by prioritizing and addressing all areas with cost assessments while aiding in grant applications.
- Have completed about 90% of upgrades to the SOP program and is still a work in progress.
- IGA Status with Chevron is still in the process there of.
- The Water Plant Sanitary Survey Report from State was received and reviewed. We incorporated a few of the recommendations that were suggested. The primary one was in regard to the locations of filter turbidity meters; this particular aspect of the plant was deemed by state as not applicable with the plant's configuration of structure and the location of the clear well. Jocelyn is searching for the documents that addressed this issue.
- Under the new State Lead and Copper regulations we had to complete a full assessment of the Town entire distribution system to include every water tap for commercial and residential users that are tied into the system. A materials assessment for every structure was also part of the assessment, Michael completed this report and sent to State for their approval prior to completing this year Lead and Copper samples.
- Monthly compliance reports were sent to state with no compliance violations for this reporting period.

- Completed the master flushing plan as needed for directional flushing, had to order a special hydrant diffuser for recording the data. High zone and CNCC flushing have been flushed prior to our DBP sampling due this Quarter. Will start flushing middle zone the first part of June.
- Backflow Cross Connection Program is currently behind for 2019, do to Michael's absence. Joe Brown will be added to the program to assist Mike so that we stay in compliance and meet the State's deadline in 2020.

#### **Wastewater Plant:**

- Still working with Deserado and filling their requirements for State, they hired an environmental engineer that will be filling the role of ORC status for both their water and wastewater, this individual has no current Colorado state licensing and we will be working with them to achieve this goal ASAP.
- The department is currently working on the basic design needed for a new headworks building as part of the wastewater engineering grant that is under way. The Department needs to narrow the scope to reduce those engineering cost. So, SGM has finished the engineering needed for the collections system repairs, and Jocelyn submitted for the CDOT permits pending approval.
- Reviewing all state correspondence and attending stakeholder meetings regarding the new wastewater nutrient standards that will be coming. Have scheduled tours of facilities that have incorporated new technologies to reduce nutrient levels to see if these applications can work for the Town facilities.
- Plant operations are good and functioning accordingly.
- State compliance reports were sent with no violations reported.
- Repaired both pond A aerator hose connectors.

**CPW Angler Harvest Incentive Proposal for Smallmouth Bass and Northern Pike  
within the Rio Blanco Water Conservancy District Boundaries  
May 16, 2019**

Smallmouth Bass

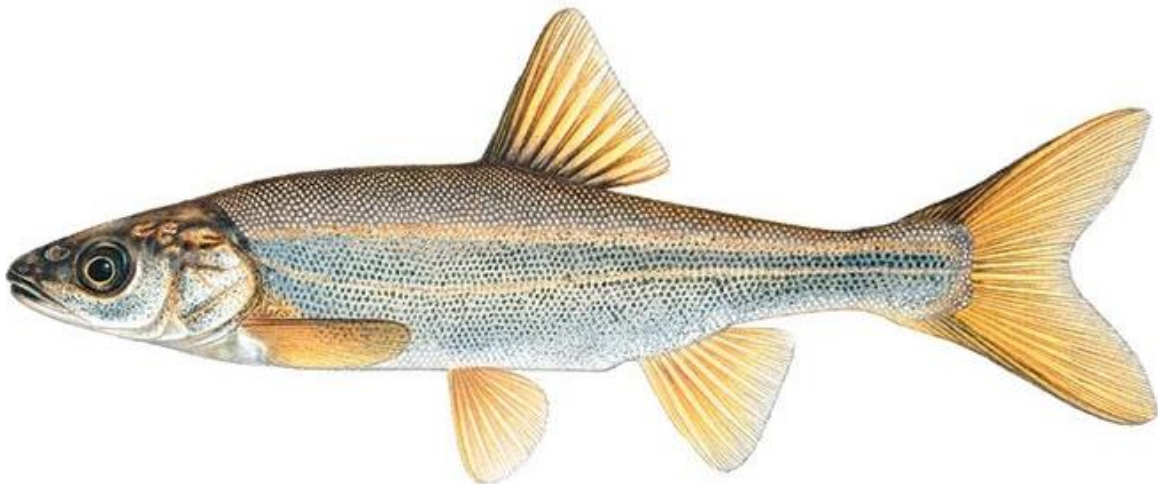
**Figure 2. Flannelmouth Sucker, illustration copyrighted by Joe Tomelleri © Joseph R. Tomelleri.**



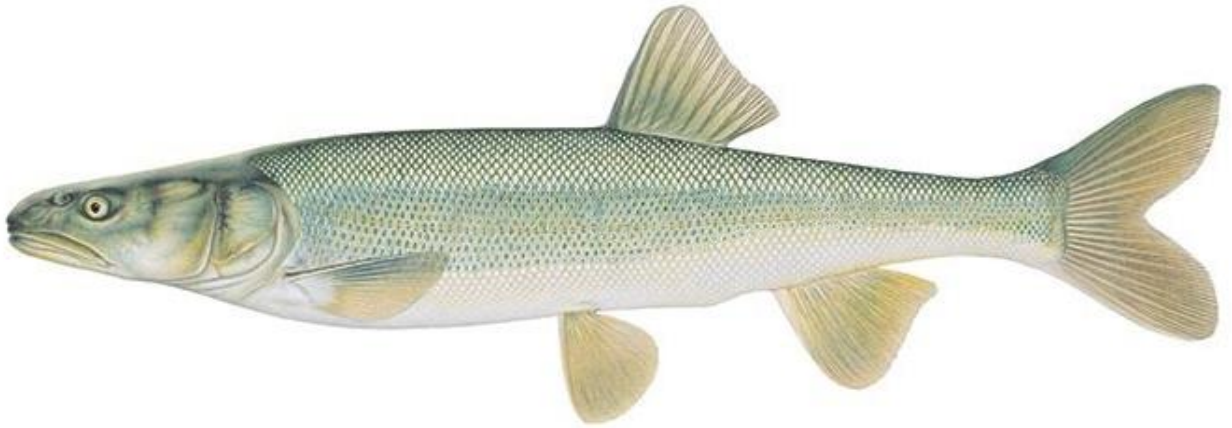
**Figure 3. Bluehead Sucker, illustration copyrighted by Joe Tomelleri © Joseph R. Tomelleri.**



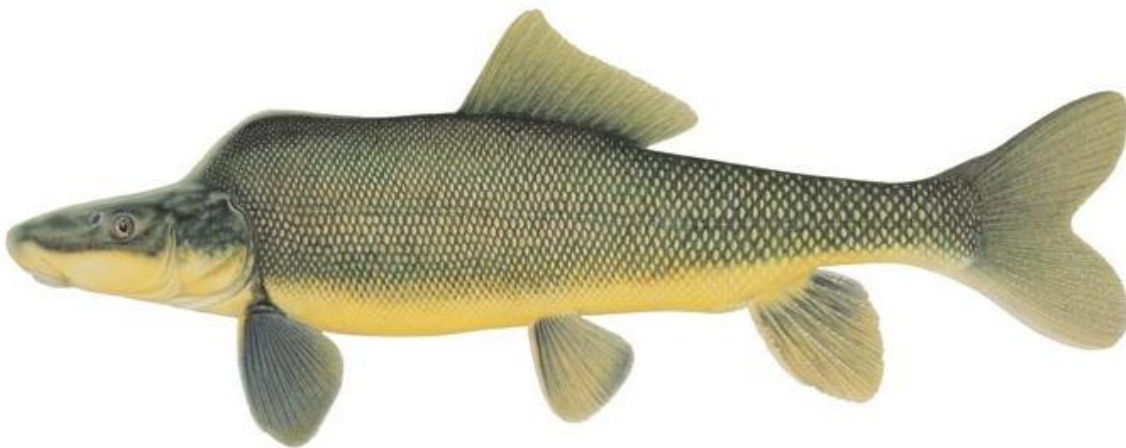
**Figure 4. Roundtail Chub, illustration copyrighted by Joe Tomelleri © Joseph R. Tomelleri.**

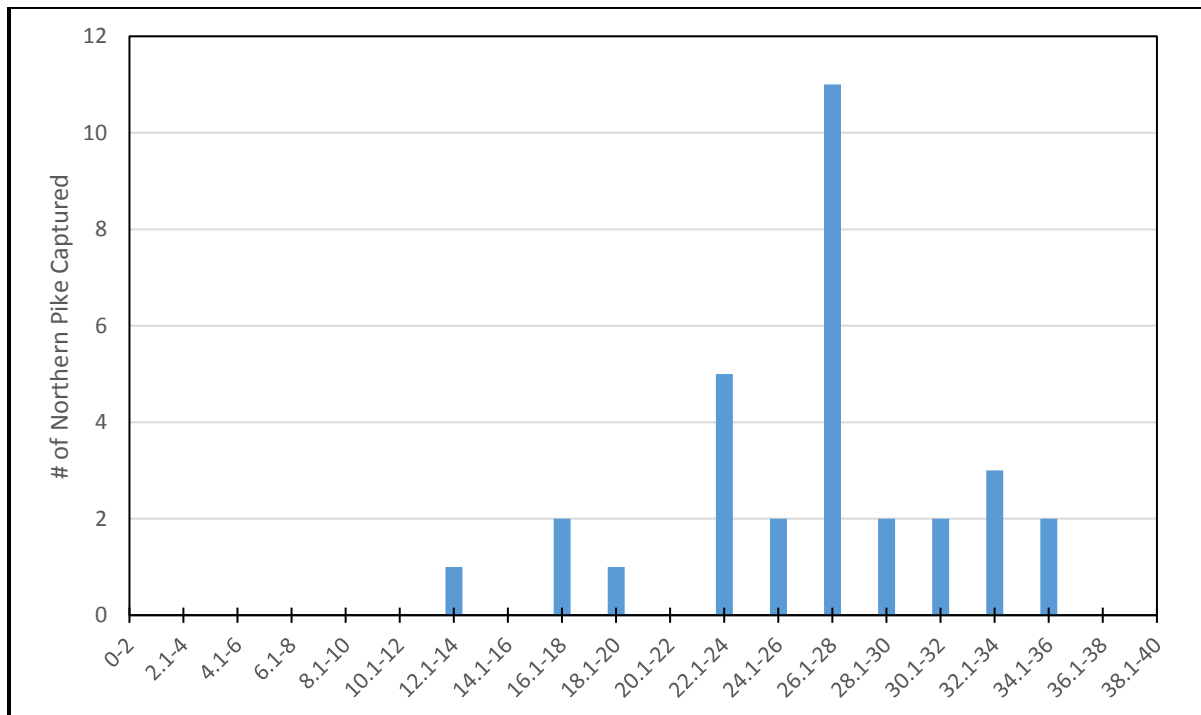
**Figure 6. Razorback Sucker, illustration copyrighted by Joe Tomelleri © Joseph R. Tomelleri.**

Smallmouth Bass (Figure 1) are not native to the White River drainage, and are problematic for native fishes-eating native fishes and competing with them for resources. This species has become well established in the White River downstream of Taylor Draw Dam. Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) manages the White River from Rio Blanco Dam downstream to the Colorado/Utah border for native fishes. This includes species that are currently not listed as Endangered or Threatened by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) under the Endangered Species Act (ESA), such as the Flannelmouth Sucker (Figure 2), Bluehead Sucker (Figure 3), and Roundtail Chub (Figure 4). Anglers may also encounter fish species that are Endangered, including the Colorado Pikeminnow (Figure 5) and Razorback Sucker (Figure 6) within the lower White River.

Since 2012, CPW, the USFWS, the State of Utah (within Utah only), and Colorado State University have been electrofishing sections of the White River downstream of Taylor Draw Dam to lethally remove all Smallmouth Bass encountered. CPW encourages anglers to help conserve and recover all native fish species by releasing these species when caught, and keeping as many Smallmouth Bass as possible. There are no harvest limits for Smallmouth Bass in Northwestern Colorado.

Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) is proposing to the Rio Blanco Water Conservancy District (District) that CPW will offer 4, harvest incentive prizes for the District's June 1-June 2, 2019 Fishing Derby. The prizes will be awarded to registered anglers whom, during the Fishing Derby, catch and keep the longest Smallmouth Bass for each of four categories: 6 years and under, 7 years to 10 years, 11 years to 15 years, and Team/Individual.

Northern Pike

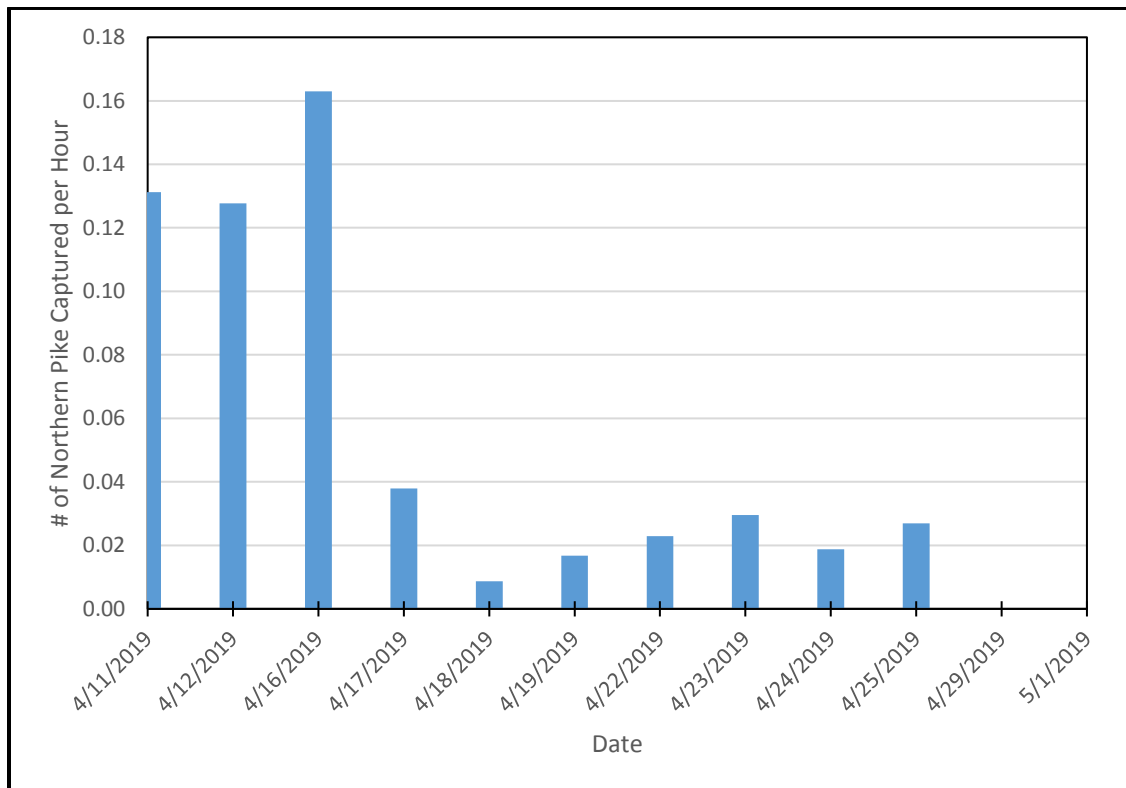


**Figure 8. Length frequency of northern pike collected in Kenney Reservoir, April 2019.**

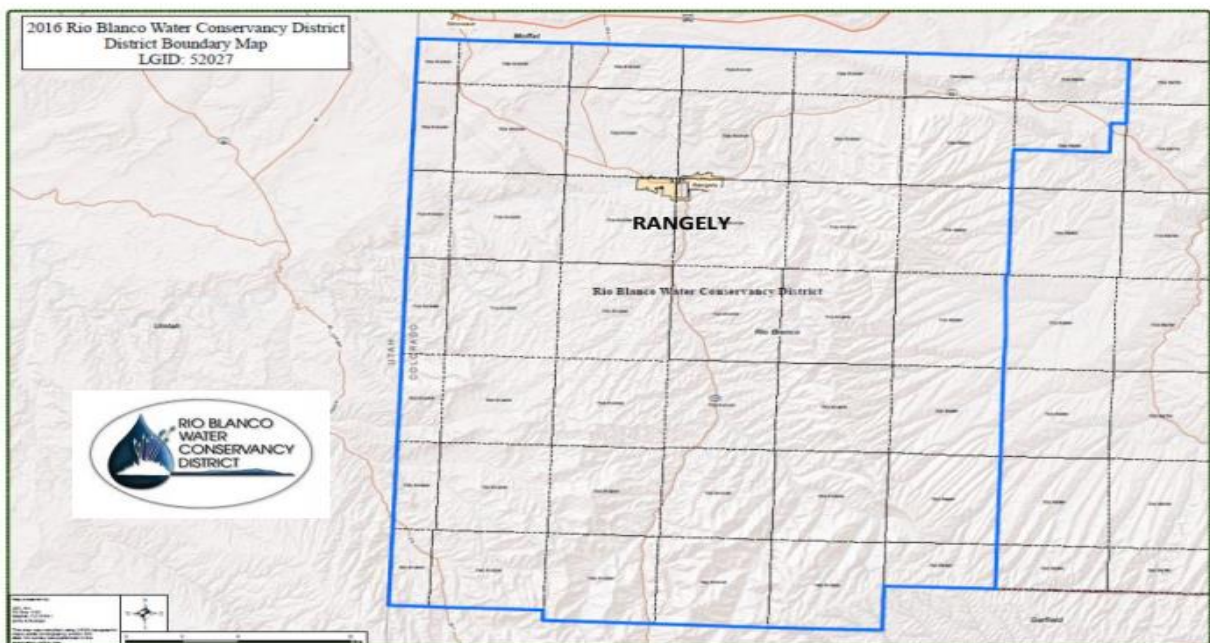




**Figure 9. Daily catch rate for northern pike collected in Kenney Reservoir, April 2019.**

Kenney Reservoir is the recent recipient of an illegal introduction of non-native Northern Pike (Figure 7). Anglers reported catching Northern Pike from Kenney Reservoir during the fishing season in 2018. CPW confirmed the presence of Northern Pike in the reservoir during standardized sampling in the fall of 2018. In April 2019, CPW personnel collected multiple size classes of Northern Pike while the fish attempted to spawn in the reservoir (Figure 8). Catch rates for Northern Pike (number of fish collected per hour of gill net sets) has declined since CPW began lethal removal efforts in mid-April once the reservoir was ice-free (Figure 9). CPW remains concerned that more Northern Pike remain in the reservoir, and that the population could expand in the reservoir, and upstream and downstream in the White River, if not controlled immediately. There are no harvest limits for Northern Pike in Northwestern Colorado.

Possible proliferation of Northern Pike in Kenney Reservoir poses a serious threat to the fishery of the reservoir itself as well as to the recreational and native fisheries in the White River upstream and downstream of the reservoir. Kenney Reservoir is an on-channel water, spilling water downstream into the White River whenever river flow into the reservoir exceeds 700 cfs. Northern Pike can predate upon and compete with other fish within the reservoir and White River.

Kenney Reservoir is managed by CPW as a put and take trout fishery, with CPW stocking catchable Rainbow Trout annually at the expense of the State of Colorado. Northern Pike are indiscriminate predators, consuming any fish they catch. With the presence of multiple age classes of Northern Pike recently detected in Kenney Reservoir, CPW has canceled the remaining 2019 catchable trout plants scheduled for Kenney Reservoir.

The White River, upstream (to the Rio Blanco Lake Dam) and downstream of Kenney Reservoir, is designated by the USFWS as critical habitat for Colorado Pikeminnow. The lower 18 miles of the White River in Utah are designated by the USFWS as critical habitat for Razorback Sucker. CPW manages the White River from Rio Blanco Lake (near Meeker) downstream to the Colorado/Utah border for native fishes. The presence of Northern Pike and Smallmouth Bass in critical habitat increases the difficulty of delisting the Endangered Colorado Pikeminnow and Razorback Sucker, while simultaneously increasing the likelihood of listing native fishes, currently not listed under the Endangered Species Act.

This year will constitute a critical period in determining whether Northern Pike will permanently establish in the reservoir. CPW is proposing to offer anglers a cash harvest incentive of \$20 for each Northern Pike caught from Kenney Reservoir, the White River, and any other waters within the boundaries of the District (Figure 10) from June 1 through November 30, 2019. The District will administer the cash harvest incentive with funds provided by CPW through a Colorado Legislative Bill that appropriates Severance Tax dollars to the Species Conservation Trust Fund.

Anglers will present their catch to the District office at 2252 East Main Street in Rangely, during typical business hours (7am to 4pm, Monday through Thursday; and 7am to 3pm on Friday) in order to receive their \$20. Anglers will be required to surrender the head of the Northern Pike to the District for scientific analysis (age, origin) by CPW, and the body of the fish will be returned to the angler. Anglers not wishing to keep Northern Pike will be allowed to donate their catch to CPW.

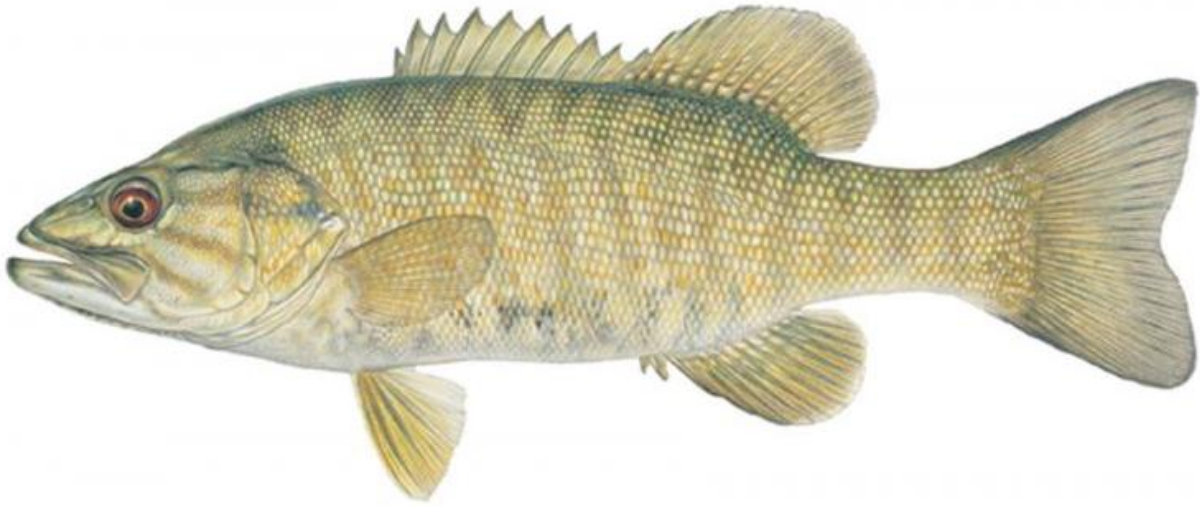
CPW will provide the District with materials to separate the Northern Pike head from the body, along with storage bags, and a chest freezer to store the fish heads. CPW will also coordinate with the District on retrieving the Northern Pike heads from the freezer. The District will be reimbursed \$20 per Northern Pike head received by CPW. The District will invoice CPW no later than December 6, 2019, and CPW will remit payment to the District no later than December 31, 2019.

With the District hosting its annual Fishing Derby in Rangely the weekend of June 1, 2019, the timing is appropriate to implement the angler harvest incentive for Northern Pike, preventing further Northern Pike establishment within the District boundaries. CPW is working to confirm that the Town of Rangely and Rangely Area Chamber of Commerce will serve as additional partners for the Northern Pike angler harvest incentive. Both entities could provide assistance with advertising and messaging regarding the illegal introduction of Northern Pike in Kenney Reservoir, and the importance of the angler harvest incentive for this non-native species.

CPW is hoping that education and outreach efforts including CPW providing its mobile aquarium with native fishes, and encouraging angler harvest of Smallmouth Bass and Northern Pike during the District's Fishing Derby and beyond will reduce the cost to the State of Colorado related to fishery management of these two illegally introduced fish species. Further, public engagement, involvement, and education will result in a more collaborative effort between CPW and the local community in managing the native and sport fisheries of the lower White River drainage.

Scheduled – June 12-14<sup>th</sup>, 2019

Dear Residents of Rangely:

The Town OF Rangely is planning to spray one of 3 days, Wednesday, June 12<sup>th</sup>, Thursday June 13<sup>th</sup> or Friday June 14<sup>th</sup>. We are coordinating our mitigation efforts with the Pest Control District.

The Town of Rangely will be spraying for public health reasons. The chemical being used is approved for mosquito and fly control at the maximum allowable rate listed on the label and applied in accordance with label instructions.

This notification will be the only notification received. Providing the exact time when aerial spraying is dependent on weather conditions and but will most likely be at sunrise or sunset.

## **Anglers encouraged to catch illegally introduced northern pike at Kenney Reservoir, earn \$20 per fish**

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### **Anglers encouraged to catch illegally introduced northern pike at Kenney Reservoir, earn \$20 per fish**

RANGELY, Colo. - The illegal, unapproved relocation of fish from one body of water to another continues to cause significant problems for management agencies, water providers and ethical anglers across Colorado.

Recently joining the list of reservoirs impacted by the presence of illegally introduced northern pike is northwest Colorado's Kenney Reservoir. In the fall of 2018, Colorado Parks and Wildlife aquatic biologists confirmed the presence of the nonnative predator in the estimated 335-surface-acre reservoir located near the town of Rangely. Authorities believe the northern pike were most likely dumped illegally into the reservoir, or the White River, by a 'bucket biologist,' a pejorative term used to describe someone that moves live fish in an effort to create their own personal, unapproved fishery.

"Releasing fish unlawfully and selfishly is self-defeating and will not work as intended," said Lori Martin, CPW's Northwest Region senior aquatic biologist. "Because northern pike are indiscriminate predators and consume any fish they catch, we will not throw our hands in the air and ignore the problem. We will take action one way or another to deal with this illegal introduction because it is very harmful and the stakes are so high. This hurt existing fisheries and it certainly has negative impacts on anglers, the majority of whom are law-abiding and ethical."

CPW says illegal fish stocking can result in fines up to \$5,000 and the permanent loss of hunting and fishing privileges. In addition, anyone convicted of illegal fish dumping will likely have to pay up to hundreds of thousands of dollars to reclaim the body of water.

The presence of northern pike has prompted CPW and reservoir owner Rio Blanco Water Conservancy District and other partners, including the Town of Rangely, Rangely Area Chamber of Commerce, Upper Colorado River Endangered Fish Recovery Program and the Colorado Water Conservation Board, to initiate an angler harvest incentive targeting all northern pike found within the District's boundaries.

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Beginning June 1 and continuing through Nov. 30, licensed anglers can earn \$20 for each northern pike caught and removed from Kenney Reservoir, the White River and other waters, from approximately Stedman Mesa to the Utah border.

Kenney Reservoir is very popular with anglers and currently recognized as an excellent channel catfish, black crappie and common carp fishery. In addition, CPW stocks rainbow trout annually at the expense of the State of Colorado; however, due to the presence of northern pike, Martin says the agency will have little choice but to cancel the remaining catchable trout plants in Kenney Reservoir in 2019. She says until the issue is resolved, she is not sure when they can resume stocking.

"Moving any live fish is a criminal act and can cause great damage to an existing fishery, threaten our native fishes and cost the sportsmen and women of Colorado thousands of dollars annually," said CPW's Area Wildlife Manager Bill de Vergie of Meeker. "We would prefer to dedicate our time and sportsmen's dollars on other projects that directly benefit the angling public, rather than spend money and manpower on fish removal efforts."

Research conducted by partners in the Upper Colorado River Endangered Fish Recovery Program has shown that the unapproved presence of nonnative predators like northern pike and smallmouth bass in critical, native fish habitat is among the most significant impediments to the recovery of Colorado's endangered fishes - Colorado pikeminnow, humpback chub, bonytail and razorback sucker. The rare species exist nowhere else in the world except in the Upper Colorado River Basin.

According to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the White River, upstream to the Rio Blanco Lake dam west of Meeker and downstream of Kenney Reservoir, is designated critical habitat for the Colorado pikeminnow, and the lower 18 miles of the White River in Utah is designated as critical habitat for razorback sucker. Smallmouth bass, northern pike and other nonnative species in these river stretches have proven detrimental to native fishes.

Other Northwest Region reservoirs dealing with the repercussions of unlawful stocking of northern pike include Green Mountain Reservoir and Wolford Mountain Reservoir. CPW and the Colorado River Water Conservation District initiated angler harvest incentives at both reservoirs several years ago, similar to the one planned at Kenney Reservoir. Licensed anglers can earn \$20 for each northern pike caught and removed.

To participate in the angler harvest incentive within the Rio Blanco Water Conservancy District's boundaries, anglers should bring their freshly caught northern pike to the District office at 2252 East Main Street in Rangely during typical business hours, 7 a.m.- 4 p.m. Monday - Thursday, and 7 a.m.- 3 p.m. on Friday. The District will administer the cash harvest incentive with funds provided by CPW through a Colorado legislative bill that appropriates severance tax dollars to the Species Conservation Trust Fund.

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To collect CPW's angler harvest incentive at Green Mountain Reservoir, anglers can bring freshly caught northern pike to the Heeney Marina during business hours. Call 970-724-9441 for more information. To collect the Colorado River Water Conservation District's angler harvest incentive at Wolford Mountain Reservoir, take the freshly caught northern pike to the campground host, or call 970-724-1266.

For each body of water, anglers must present their fishing license to qualify for the harvest incentive.

"Our removal efforts thus far have been effective at reducing the number of northern pike in Kenney and we believe the population is still relatively small," said Martin. "But northern pike are prolific and it doesn't take long for a small population to grow, especially if no management action is taken. We encourage anglers to participate and help us eliminate northern pike from Kenney and the surrounding area. If the pike population continues to grow, we may have to resort to less palatable options for managing against northern pike in the future."

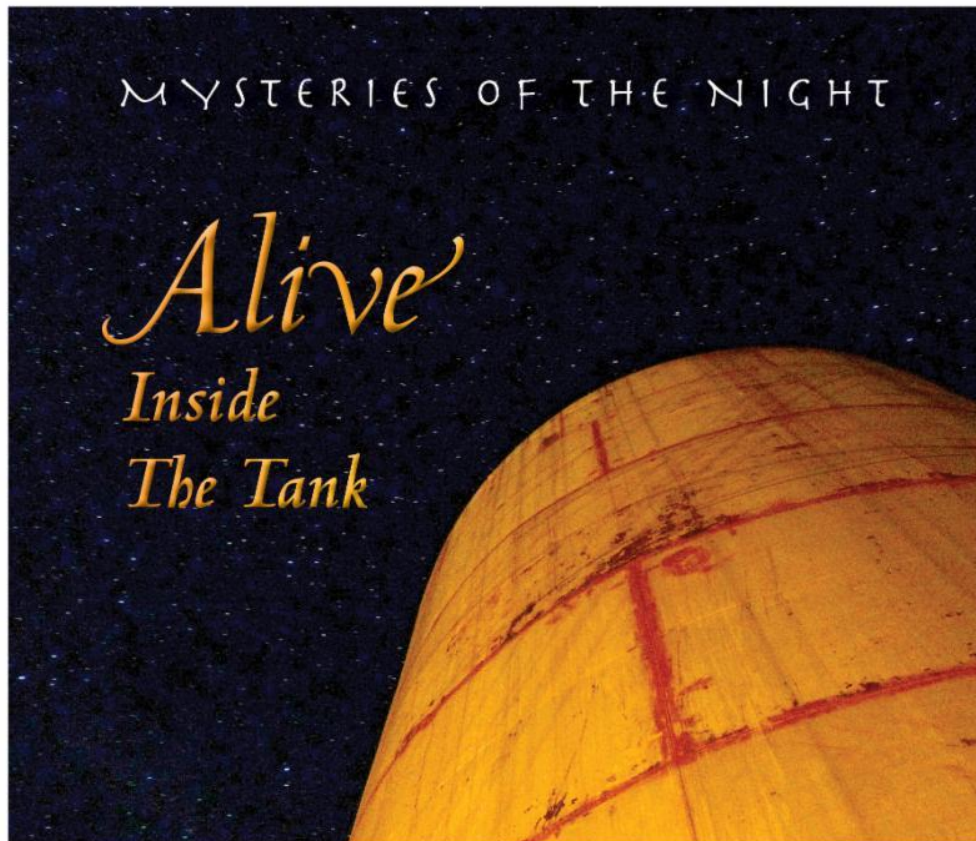

**PARTY PREHEARING STATEMENT**

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The 14 undersigned local governments: *Garfield County, Delta County, Jackson County, Mesa County, Moffat County, Montezuma County, Rio Blanco County, City of Craig, Town of Collbran, Town of Meeker, Town of New Castle, Town of Parachute, Town of Rangely and Town of Silt* **collectively participating as the Western Local Governments (WLG)** coalition hereby submit our Party Prehearing Statement in the above-captioned matter as follows:

Garfield County is the lead representative for the Western Local Governments (WLG) coalition.

**I. Statement of Position**

WLG generally supports the draft rule changes with a notable exception. Draft redline rules lack adequate specificity for procedures and locations for hearings assigned to Administrative Law Judges and Hearing Officers:

Additional rule language should be drafted to require certain Administrative Law Judge and Hearing Officer proceedings be held in Western Colorado and other locales outside the metro Denver area and more proximate to the lands, minerals, local governments and other stakeholders most directly impacted by the matters under consideration.

Many of the issues contemplated by the General Assembly and addressed in Senate Bill 19-181 are nearly uniquely associated with mineral development issues in the urbanized areas of Colorado's Front Range. As such, it would be appropriate for the Commission to develop new, location-based, application hearing and adjudication processes located within Colorado's more rural oil and gas basins of Colorado so that those applications are not held up by the vastly more numerous and complex urban Front Range applications.

New rule language should be drafted to specify timeframes and deadlines for assignment of applications to an Administrative Law Judge or Hearing Officer, and further, to specify timeframes for adjudication of applications.

**II.      Witness List**

John Martin, Chair, Garfield County Commission, and Kirby Wynn, Garfield County Oil & Gas Liaison are expected to testify as witnesses with respect to local government issues concerning this Rulemaking and proposed rules changes.

Depending on the issues raised in other parties Prehearing Statements, WLG reserves the right to name 1-2 additional or alternate witnesses with expertise to testify with respect to the local government issues concerning this Rulemaking and proposed rules changes.

**V.      Statement of Relief Requested**

WLG requests that the Commission adopt changes to the 500 Series rules as currently redlined with additional language designating a new, location-based, application hearing and adjudication processes located within Colorado's more rural oil and gas basins so that those applications are not held up by the vastly more numerous and complex Front Range applications.

WLG requests additional rule language be drafted to specify efficient and reasonable timeframes and deadlines for assignment of applications to an Administrative Law Judge or Hearing Officer, and further, to specify timeframes for adjudication of applications.

WLG reserves the right to supplement its statement of relief requested in our Response to Prehearing Statements. This additional relief may include a request for the Commission to deny requested relief by parties for items and issues outside the narrowly defined scope of the Rulemaking Statement of Basis and Purpose.

**VI.     Estimated Time Required for Case Presentation**

WLG and its 14-member local government coalition expect substantive issues in other parties Prehearing Statements may need to be addressed and anticipates 25 minutes to present its case in chief. Additional time, as will be designated in WLG's Response to Prehearing Statements, may be needed to respond to other parties requested relief or alternate proposals.
