Create a succession plan that embeds diversity across the community

Projects

- Attract desirable, qualified candidates to maintain strong performance standards and prepare others to lead on the Board
 - Youth, including high school and college-aged students
 - Middle-aged residents, as this age range is Rangely's largest population
 - New residents to bring new perspective
 - Business owners, which is a major stakeholder group
- Promote accomplishments to demonstrate board-driven value and impact
 - Communicate and market the board member opportunity
 - Target market to identified audiences
 - Educate others on the purpose of the TREAD program
- Develop formal succession plan
 - Review 3 other Main Street Program's succession plans to gather ideas
 - Identify future successors for leadership to ensure continuity of the TREAD program

Balance championing and supporting community events

Projects

- Create event planning packet for educating others and consistent planning
- Develop checklist to guide planning (e.g., obtain licenses, forming board, etc.)
- Identify guiding principles such as marketing, points of contact, business owner impact
- Design exit plan for TREAD supported projects
 - Consider project support lifecycle
 - Specify when TREAD should step away to let others take full ownership
- Initiate and or support events that support TREAD Program mission as they arise
 - Hometown Heroes, Arbor Day, SeptemberFest Parade and others
 - As residents approach TREAD with event ideas, provide support with education so they may lead successful events while maintaining ownership

Continue to advance aesthetic and infrastructure improvements along Main Street

Projects

- Seek grant funding for construction of multi-modal improvements to the East Entrance
- Create attention-getting space for those driving through to stop
- Increase artwork representation
- Develop Main Street design standards and make accessible
 - Create a repository for documents
 - Consistent standards (font, dimensions)
 - Infrastructure and sidewalk standards
- Continue to seek funding to engineer segments of Trails Master Plan
- Continue to seek funding for sidewalk widening
 - Gather budgeting feedback
