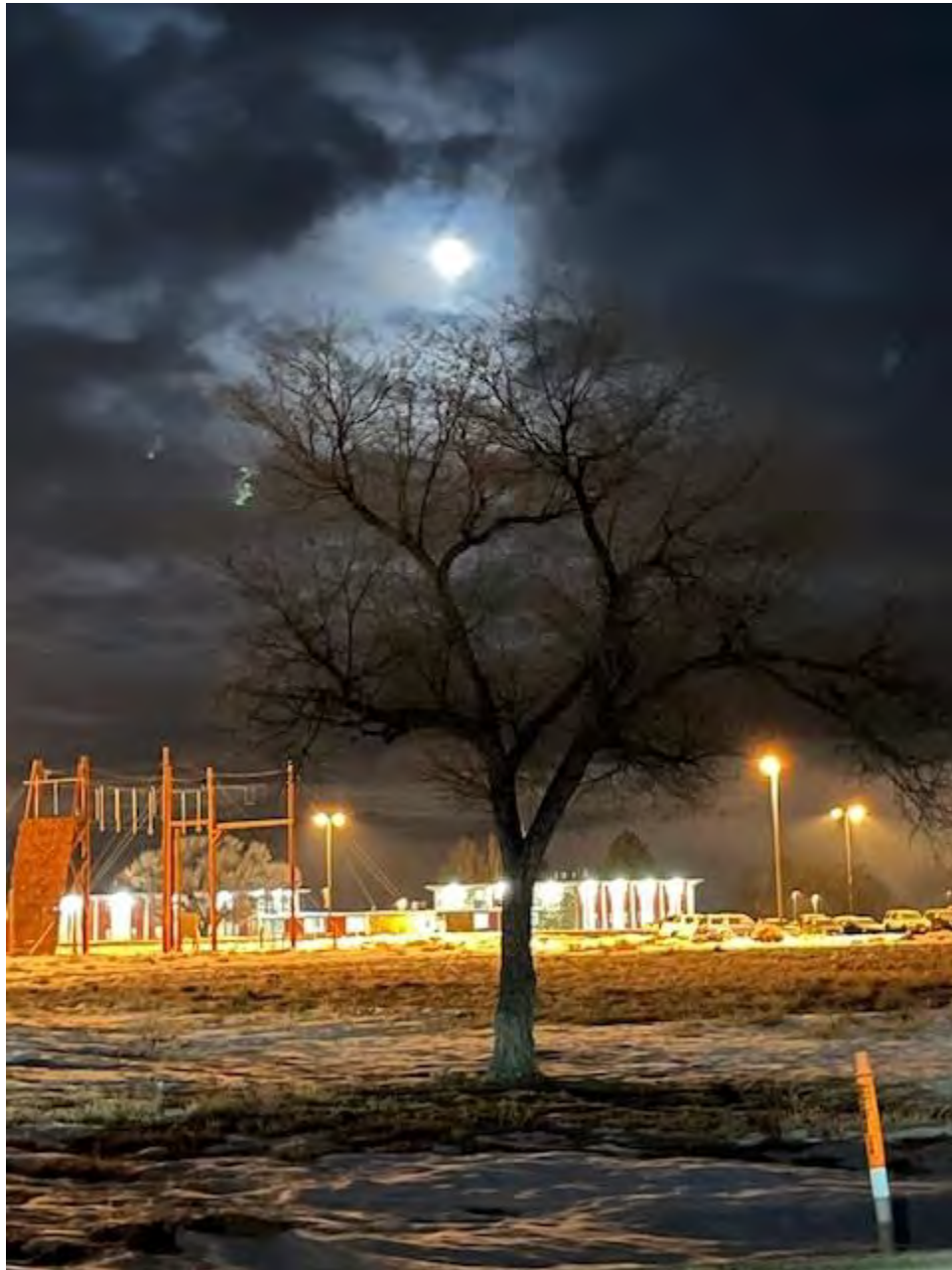

Ordinance 702 (2025)

AN ORDINANCE TO DEANNEX THE CHAMBER MINOR SUBDIVISION, FROM THE BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWN OF RANGELY PLACING THEM BACK INTO RIO BLANCO COUNTY JURISDICTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Town of Rangely, Colorado pursuant to Colorado statues and the Town of Rangely Municipal Code, are vested with the authority of administering the affairs of the Town of Rangely, Colorado, and

WHEREAS, the owner has provided notices pursuant to C.R.S. 31-12.501, et seq. and, to the knowledge of the Town, no requests for a meeting have been received by the Town from Rio Blanco County or any of the special Districts involved, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has determined that the best interest of the Town will not be prejudiced by the de-annexation of the Property

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL FOR THE TOWN OF RANGELY, COLORADO:

The Board of Trustees is of the opinion that the best interest of the municipality will not be prejudiced by the de-annexation of the Property, as described in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, from the Town. Therefore, the property is hereby de-annexed from the Town.

Town Staff are hereby authorized the directed to take all necessary steps, if any, to effectuate the de-annexation. To the extent the mayor is needed to effectuate the de-annexation, the mayor is hereby authorized to take all necessary steps to effectuate the de-annexation

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is, fore any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the final decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance

EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its publication as provided in C.R.S. 30-15.405.

SB23-290

Natural Medicine Regulation and Legalization

In 2022, Colorado voters passed Proposition 122, which required the Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA) to establish a regulatory framework for the administration of certain natural psychedelics in licensed facilities and to decriminalize the use of certain natural psychedelics.

This act reorganizes and amends the voter-approved legislation but largely retains the broadly permissive personal use provisions as well as restrictions on local control related to personal use and licensed administration and cultivation.

With regard to regulated activities, DORA must start accepting “facilitator” licensure applications by December 31, 2024, which covers the cultivation, manufacturing, testing, storage, distribution, transport, transfer, and dispensation of regulated natural psychedelics. The act outline types of business licenses, which include a health center license, cultivation facility license, manufacturer license, testing facility license, and any other licenses determined necessary by the division, and occupation licenses and registrations for owners, staff, and contractors who work or have access to restricted areas.

The act preempts local laws that conflict with its provisions and expressly prohibits local governments from prohibiting licensed facilitators and licensed entities from operating in their jurisdictions. **Local governments continue to be able to regulate the time, place, and manner of the operation of licensed entities.**

As in Proposition 122, the act immediately decriminalizes the personal cultivation, use, and giving away of certain natural psychedelics if the person is twenty-one years of age or older and only within the context of counseling, spiritual guidance, beneficial community-based use and healing, supported use, or related services. Personal cultivation is acceptable in locked rooms no larger than 12x12 feet.

The act clarifies the impact of personal use standards on employers and confirms that Employers can have policies relating to the use of or impairment from natural medicine in the workplace. The act allows those under the age of 21 to be fined up to \$100 or attend four hours of substance use education or counseling, and creates new crimes including:

- facilitating without a license (a class 2 misdemeanor);
- open consumption of natural psychedelics (drug petty offense and a fine of up to \$100 and up to 24 hours of public service);
- illegal cultivation (drug petty offense and a fine of up to \$1,000); and
- unlicensed and illegal manufacturing (level 2 drug felony) Peace officers may apprehend individuals for violations of this act.

EMERGENCY ORDINANCE 703 (2025)

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AMENDING THE RANGELY MUNICIPAL CODE TO ADD REGULATIONS GOVERNING NATURAL MEDICINE BUSINESSES

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Rangely, Colorado (the "Council"), pursuant to Colorado statute is vested with the authority to enact ordinances for the preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare of the Town of Rangely, Colorado (the "Town"); and

WHEREAS, the People of the State of Colorado approved the citizens' initiative known as "Proposition 122: Access to Natural Psychedelic Substances," which was codified in the Colorado Revised Statute Sections 12-170-102 through 117, and

WHEREAS, Enabling Act decriminalizes the personal possession, growing, sharing, and use, but not the sale, psychedelic mushrooms (psilocybin and psilocin) and three plant-based psychedelic substances (dimethyltryptamine, ibogaine, and mescaline); and

WHEREAS, the Enabling Act allows the supervised use of psychedelic mushrooms by individuals aged 21 and over at licensed facilities and requires the state to create a regulatory structure for the operation of those licensed facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Enabling Act allows the state to expand the type of substances that may be used in licensed facilities to include plant-based psychedelic substances (dimethyltryptamine, ibogaine, and mescaline), beginning in 2026; and

WHEREAS, the Enabling Act prohibits local governments from banning licensed facilities, services, and the use of natural psychedelic substances permitted by the Enabling Act, but permits the local governments to regulate the time, place, and manner of operation of these facilities; and

WHEREAS, the State Legislature enacted Senate Bill 23-290, which is codified in Colorado Revised Statutes Sections 44-50-101 through 904 (the "Regulatory Act"), to create the regulatory structure for the operation of licensed facilities, which includes the licensing and registration of facilities and related businesses that provide for the use, cultivation, manufacture and testing of these substances; and

WHEREAS, the Regulatory Act prohibits local governments from banning licensed facilities, services, and use of natural psychedelic substances permitted by the Regulatory Act while allowing local governments to regulate the time, place and manner of operation of such facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Regulatory Act provides that the "state licensing authority will "not receive or act upon an application for issuance of a natural medicine business license"... "[for] a location in an area where the cultivation, manufacturing, testing, storage, distribution, transfer, and dispensation of

Natural medicine or Natural medicine product as contemplated is not permitted under the applicable zoning laws of the local jurisdiction;" and

WHEREAS, the Regulatory Act further provides that the state licensing authority will not receive or act upon an application for the issuance of a Natural Medicine Business License if "the building where natural medicine services are provided is within one thousand feet of a child care center, preschool, elementary, middle, junior, or high school; or a residential child care facility ... ;" and

WHEREAS, the Regulatory Act further provides that "the governing body of a municipality, by ordinance; ... may vary the distance restrictions imposed by [the Regulatory Act]...for a License or may eliminate one or more types of schools or facilities from the application of a distance restriction established by or pursuant to [the Regulatory Act]..." and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Rangely desires to enact this ordinance to regulate the time, place and manner of the operation of licenses issued pursuant to the Regulatory Act; to establish the appropriate zone districts for the operation of licenses issued pursuant to the Regulatory Act; and to establish distance restrictions for buildings where natural medicine services are provided within the vicinity of a child care center; preschool, elementary, middle, junior or high school; a residential child care facility; or residential dwellings pursuant to the Regulatory Act; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Rangely finds it necessary for the preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Rangely to immediately update the Town Code regarding zoning and regulation of natural medicine facilities leading up to the 2025 state imposed regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF RANGELY, COLORADO:

9.30 OPTIONAL PREMISES LICENSES STANDARD NATURAL MEDICINE

9.30.010 Definitions

Natural medicine means psilocybin or psilocyn and other substances described as "natural medicine" in the Colorado Natural Medicine Code, as codified in Colorado Rev. Stat. §§ 44-50-101 through 904 (the "Regulatory Act").

Natural medicine business means any of the following entities licensed under the Regulatory Act: a natural medicine healing center, a natural medicine cultivation facility, a natural medicine products manufacturer, or a natural medicine testing facility or another licensed entity created by the state licensing authority.

Natural medicine healing center means a facility where an entity is licensed by the state licensing authority that permits a facilitator as defined by the Regulatory Act, to provide and supervise natural medicine services for a participant as defined by the Regulatory Act, which

includes a participant consuming and experiencing the effects of regulated natural medicine or regulated natural medicine products under the supervision of a facilitator.

Natural medicine product means a product infused with natural medicine that is intended for consumption, as provided by the Regulatory Act.

Natural medicine services mean a preparation session, administrative session, or integration session, as provided by the Regulatory Act.

Participant means an individual who is twenty-one (21) years of age or older who receives natural medicine services prescribed by and under the supervision of a facilitator, as provided by the Regulatory Act.

Regulated natural medicine means natural medicine that is cultivated, manufactured tested, stored, distributed, transported, or dispensed, as provided by the Regulatory Act

Regulated natural medicine product means a natural medicine product that is cultivated, manufactured, tested, stored, distributed, transported, or dispensed, as provided by the Regulator

State licensing authority means the authority created under the Regulatory Act for the purpose of regulating and controlling the licensing of the cultivation, manufacturing, testing, storing, distribution, transfer, and dispensation of regulated natural medicine and regulated natural medicine products, as provided by the Regulatory Act.

9.30.020 Permitted location for a natural medicine healing center.

Natural medicine healing centers will be permitted in the Industrial Zone. Natural medicine healing centers will be prohibited in all other zone districts in the Town.

All Natural Medicine Healing centers shall be required to comply as follows:

- a) Shall have a security plan for the secure storage of natural medicine and natural medicine products approved by the State of Colorado Natural Medicine Division and shall provide the plan to the Town for approval prior to beginning operation and shall provide any updated plans to the Town within ten (10) business days of updates.
- b) Shall have a video surveillance system that provides coverage of all facility entrances and exits.
- c) Shall have a security alarm system that provides coverage of all facility entrances and exits, rooms with exterior windows, rooms with interior walls or walls shared with other building tenants, roof hatches, skylights and storage rooms containing safes or vaults.
- d) All doorways, windows, and other openings shall be located, covered, or screened in such manner to prevent a view into the interior from any exterior public or semi-public area; and
- e) All storage for Natural Medicine Healing Centers shall be located within a permanent building and may not be located within a trailer, tent, or motor vehicle.

9.30.030 Permitted location for other natural medicine businesses.

Natural medicine cultivation facility, natural medicine products manufacturer, natural medicine testing facility, and other licensed entity created by the state licensing authority (collectively the "licensed facilities") will be permitted in the Industrial Zone. Licensed facilities are prohibited in all other zones of the Town.

9.30.040 Distance restrictions from schools.

All distance restrictions imposed by Colorado Revised Statutes Section 44-50-302(l)(d)(I) are hereby adopted as follows. A building where natural medicine services are provided may not be within one thousand (1,000) feet of a childcare center; preschool; elementary middle, junior, or high school; or a residential childcare facility (collectively "school").

9.30.050 Hours of operation - natural medicine healing centers.

Natural medicine healing centers may only operate between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. (noon), Monday through Friday.

9.30.060 Storage of natural medicine at businesses.

All storage of regulated natural medicine and regulated natural medicine products shall be in a secured and locked container. Cultivation facilities shall ensure that any natural medicine under cultivation is kept in an enclosed locked area.

9.30.070 Odor from natural medicine businesses.

Natural medicine businesses shall use an air filtration and ventilation system ensuring that the odors from natural medicine and natural medicine products are confined to the premises and are not detectable beyond the property boundaries on which the business is located.

9.30.080 Natural medicine businesses secure disposal.

Natural medicine businesses shall provide secure disposal of natural medicine and natural medicine product remnants or by-products. Natural medicine and natural medicine product remnants or by-products shall not be placed within the business's exterior refuse contain

9.30.090 Processing of natural medicine.

- a) The processing of natural medicine that includes the use of hazardous materials, including without limitation, and by way of example, flammable and combustible liquids, carbon dioxide, and liquified petroleum gases, such as butane, is prohibited.
- b) Nonhazardous materials used to process natural medicine shall be stored in a manner so as to mitigate and ensure odors are not detectable beyond the
- c) property boundaries on which the processing facility is located or the exterior walls of the processing facility associated with the processing of natural medicine.
- d) The processing of natural medicine shall meet the requirements of all adopted Town building and life/safety codes.
- e) The processing of natural medicine shall meet all the requirements of all adopted sewer regulations.

9.30.100 Nuisance.

It is unlawful and deemed a nuisance to dispose of, discharge out of or from, or permit to flow from any facility associated with natural medicine, any foul or noxious liquid or substance of any kind whatsoever, including, without limitation, by-products of the natural medicine or natural medicine processes, into or upon any adjacent ground or lot, into any street, alley or public place, or into any municipal storm sewer and or system in the town.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL FOR THE TOWN OF RANGELY, COLORADO:

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the final decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such a decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance

EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its publication as provided in C.R.S. 30-15.405.

Project status/Current Issues:

Water Treatment Plant:

- We can't track the flow in the river using gauges from USGS due to ice in the river. We will be able to resume tracking flows in spring.
- Snowpack has dropped to 90%. With how warm it's already starting to get; this is something we'll really need to keep an eye on.
- Average daily water output from the plant in January was 221k gallons.
- Compliance samples and reports were submitted with no violations.
- CleanWater1 will be starting up the tank mixers for all three of the water storage tanks on February 4th.
- Motors for both the river pump station and MZ #3 have been rebuilt and returned, and the pump for MZ #3 has been rebuilt and are just waiting on delivery. The pump for the river pump station is still on order.
- The lab inspection went well, and we just needed to make a few minor adjustments to some of the forms we were using.
- Filter 3's chlorine injection quill had broke, so we needed to wait a few weeks for a replacement. It is finally back online, and we will now be able to take the other two filters down for pressure washing and super-chlorination.
- Chlorine replacement piping and fittings have been ordered, we will hopefully have the whole line replaced by the end of February, depending on when the parts arrive.

Wastewater Plant:

- After sending photos and videos of the configuration of the Huber package plant in headworks, it was determined that the screen brush needed adjustment. After performing this adjustment, the Huber is screening. We hope to prevent the majority of wipes and trash from the collection system from entering the effluent Clearwell and ponds.
- The heater in the new headworks building continues to trip and needs to be manually reset. The town has requested that Kuck HVAC schedule a service visit for training and the manual for the heater as these were not provided upon installation.
- Compliance samples were taken and the December DMR was submitted. Due to a lab data entry error, we reported two samples above permit limits.
- Utility operators pulled the east aerator, removed a piece of wood preventing the impeller from turning, trash and debris in the pond continues to present problems for the continuous operation of the aerators.

Resolution 2025-01

A RESOLUTION REGARDING THE RANGELY SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT DISCHARGE WATER RIGHT

WHEREAS, the Town of Rangely (“Rangely”) is a statutory town in Rio Blanco County, State of Colorado, United States; and

WHEREAS, in Case No. 80CW454, Rangely adjudicated a conditional water right for the Rangely Sewage Treatment Plant Discharge (“Water Right”) for the purposes of domestic, municipal, irrigation, industrial, piscatorial and recreational uses in the amount of 3.1 cubic feet per second (“c.f.s.”);

WHEREAS, at present, 2.0 c.f.s. of the Water Right are absolute for irrigation uses, 1.1 c.f.s. of the Water Right are conditional for irrigation uses, 3.1 c.f.s. of the Water Right are conditional for industrial, piscatorial and recreational uses.

WHEREAS, Rangely must file a diligence application on or before February 28, 2025 to continue the conditional uses of the Water Right;

WHEREAS, Rangely desires no longer to pursue the development of the conditional uses of the Water Right for piscatorial and recreational purposes:

WHEREAS, Rangely’s desire to cancel the conditional uses of the Water Right for piscatorial and recreational purposes does not extend to any other portion or use of the Water Right. Rangely has no intent to abandon the 2.0 c.f.s., of the Water Right absolute for irrigation use, 1.1 c.f.s. of the Water Right conditional for irrigation use, or 3.1 c.f.s. of the Water Right conditional for industrial use.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Town of Rangely Board of Trustees having duly considered this matter

1. Rangely will not prosecute a diligence application for the conditional portions of the Water Right for piscatorial and recreational uses and will request the court cancel these conditional uses.
2. Rangely will file an application with the water court in February 2025 requesting a finding of diligence for the conditional industrial use in the amount of 3.1 c.f.s. and the conditional irrigation use in the amount of 1.1 c.f.s., and to make absolute any additional portion of the Water Right for these uses as appropriate.
