

The Colorado Liquor Code, section 44-3-101. et seq. ("Liquor Code"), and the Colorado Liquor Rules, 1 CCR 203-2 ("Liquor Rules"), require compliance with certain tax obligations, and set forth the investigative, disciplinary and licensure actions the state and local licensing authorities may take for violations of the Liquor Code and Liquor Rules, including failure to meet tax reporting and payment obligations.

The Waiver is made pursuant to section 39-21-113(4), C.R.S., and any other law, regulation, resolution or ordinance concerning the confidentiality of tax information, or any document, report or return filed in connection with state or local taxes. This Waiver shall be valid until the expiration or revocation of a license, or until both the state and local licensing authorities take final action to approve or deny any application(s) for the renewal of the license, whichever is later. Applicant/Licensee agrees to execute a new waiver for each subsequent licensing period in connection with the renewal of any license, if requested.

By signing below, Applicant/Licensee requests that the Colorado Department of Revenue and any other state or local taxing authority or agency in the possession of tax documents or information, release information and documentation to the Colorado Liquor Enforcement Division, and is duly authorized employees, to act as the Applicant's/Licensee's duly authorized representative under section 39-21-113(4), C.R.S., solely to allow the state and local licensing authorities, and their duly authorized employees, to investigate compliance with the Liquor Code and Liquor Rules. Applicant/Licensee authorizes the state and local licensing authorities, their duly authorized employees, and their legal representatives, to use the information and documentation obtained using this Waiver in any administrative or judicial action regarding the application or license.





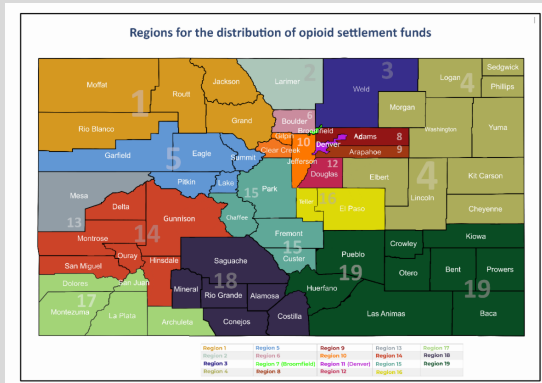
Local and Statewide Impact

In August 2021, after announcing several historic settlements with major drug manufacturers and distributors, the office announced a groundbreaking framework for distributing nearly \$400 million in opioid settlement dollars throughout the state for addiction treatment, recovery, and prevention programs. Proceeds from the settlements include up to:

- \$300 million from Johnson & Johnson and three major drug distributors*;
- At least \$50 million from Purdue Pharma and the Sacklers;
- \$25 million from Mallinckrodt; and
- \$10 million from McKinsey & Company.

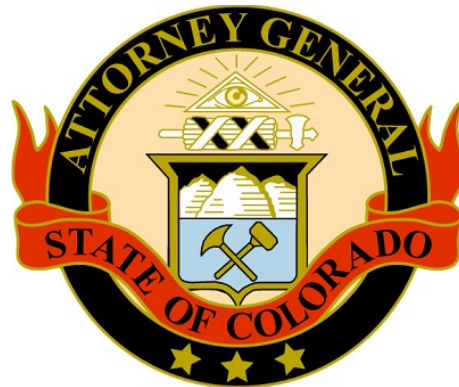
These dollars will be distributed to 19 regions, local governments, the state, and infrastructure needs.

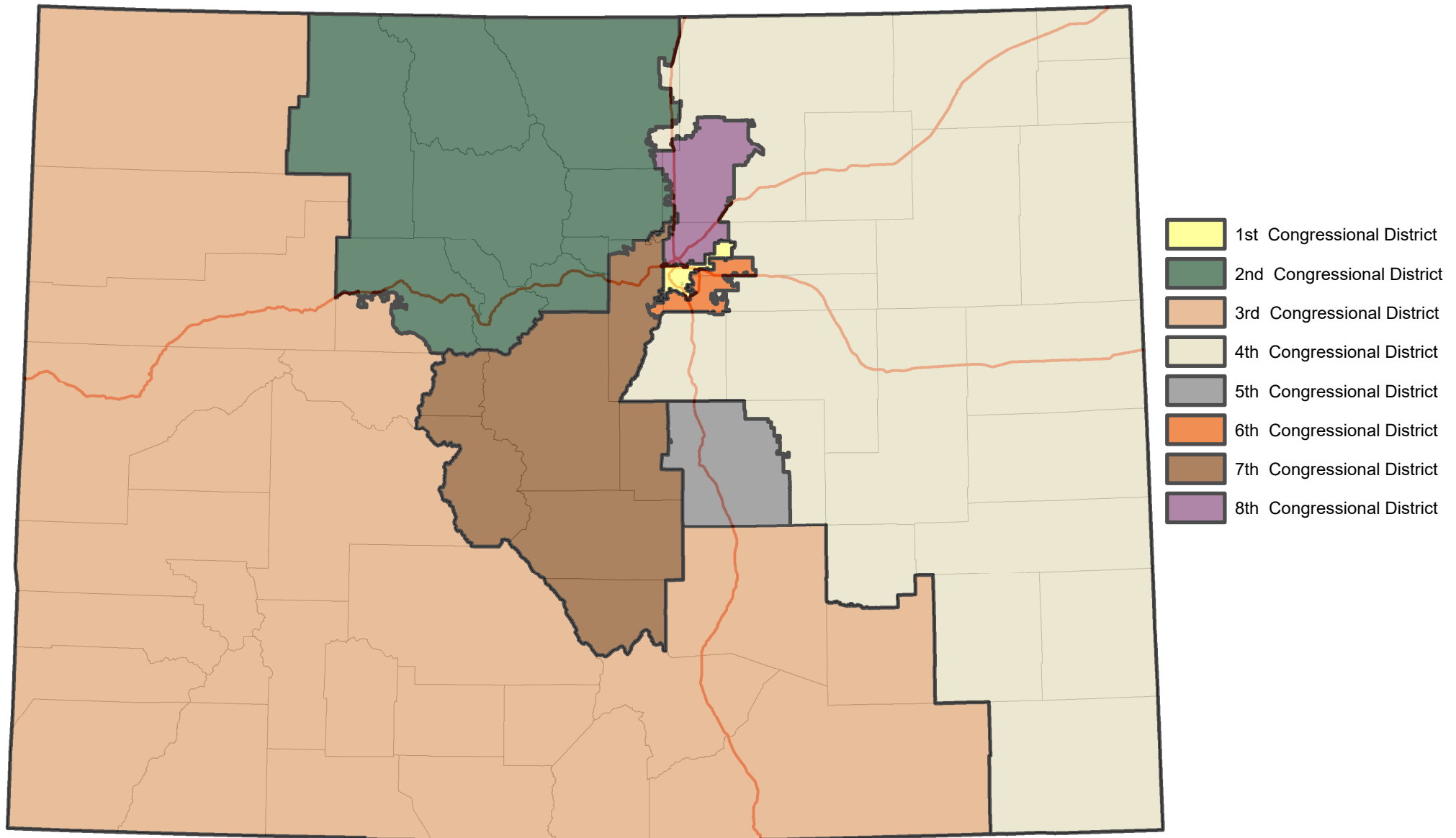

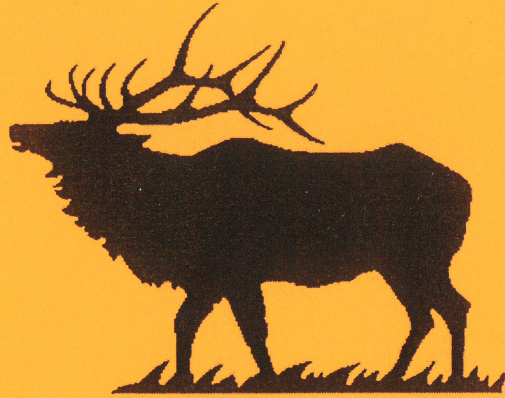

**Flu shots are now available by appointment (65+ high dose available). Starting the week of 9/27, Drive through clinics will begin from 4:30-6:00pm on the 2nd and 4th Monday in Meeker at the Fairgrounds, and the 2nd and 4th Thursday in Rangely in between the library and public health building. All insurance accepted.*

Third doses of mRNA vaccine (both Pfizer and Moderna) are currently recommended for moderately to severely immunocompromised individuals. Please contact your doctor to see if you fall into this category. On September 23rd, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) officially recommended Pfizer-BioNTech's COVID-19 vaccine booster shots for everyone over age 65, people whose work puts them at high risk of contracting COVID-19, and people age 18 and older based on their own decision relating to their risk from COVID. Booster doses should be given approximately six months after their Pfizer-BioNTech primary series. **Moderna booster doses were recommended unanimously by the FDA last week, and formal approval is expected by this Thursday, 10/21 from ACIP for a half dose booster for these same groups.*

**Roll out of pediatric doses of Pfizer for 5-11 year olds is expected to begin by the end of the month, and planning/ordering has begun. These will be available through RBC Public Health.*

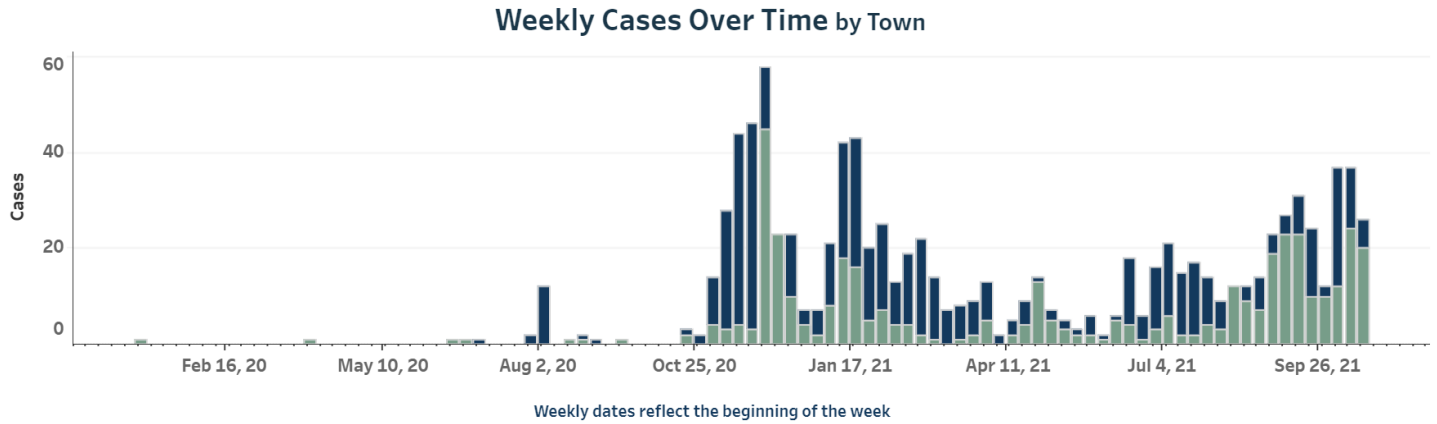
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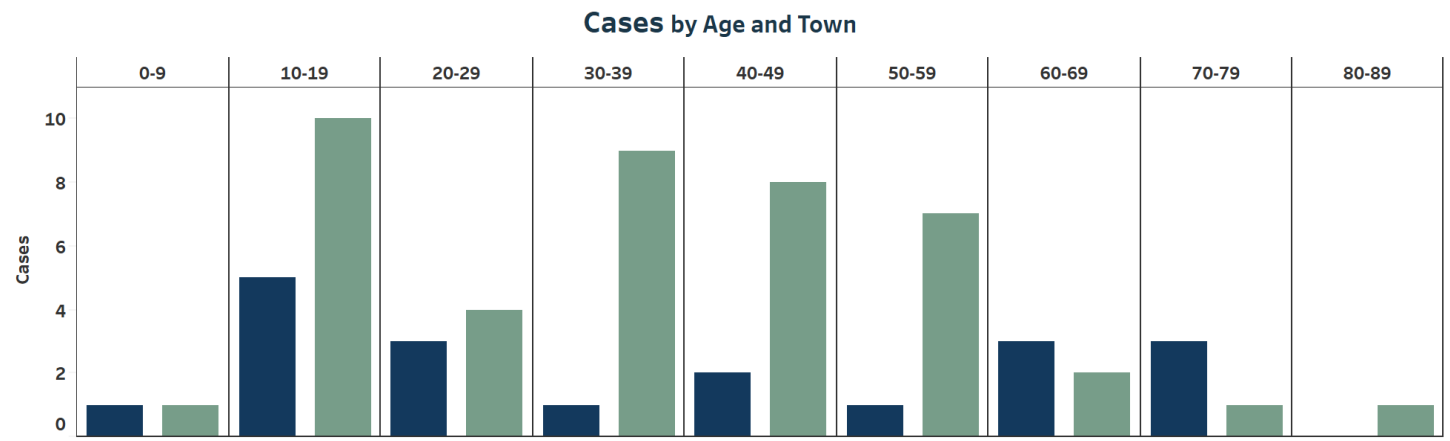

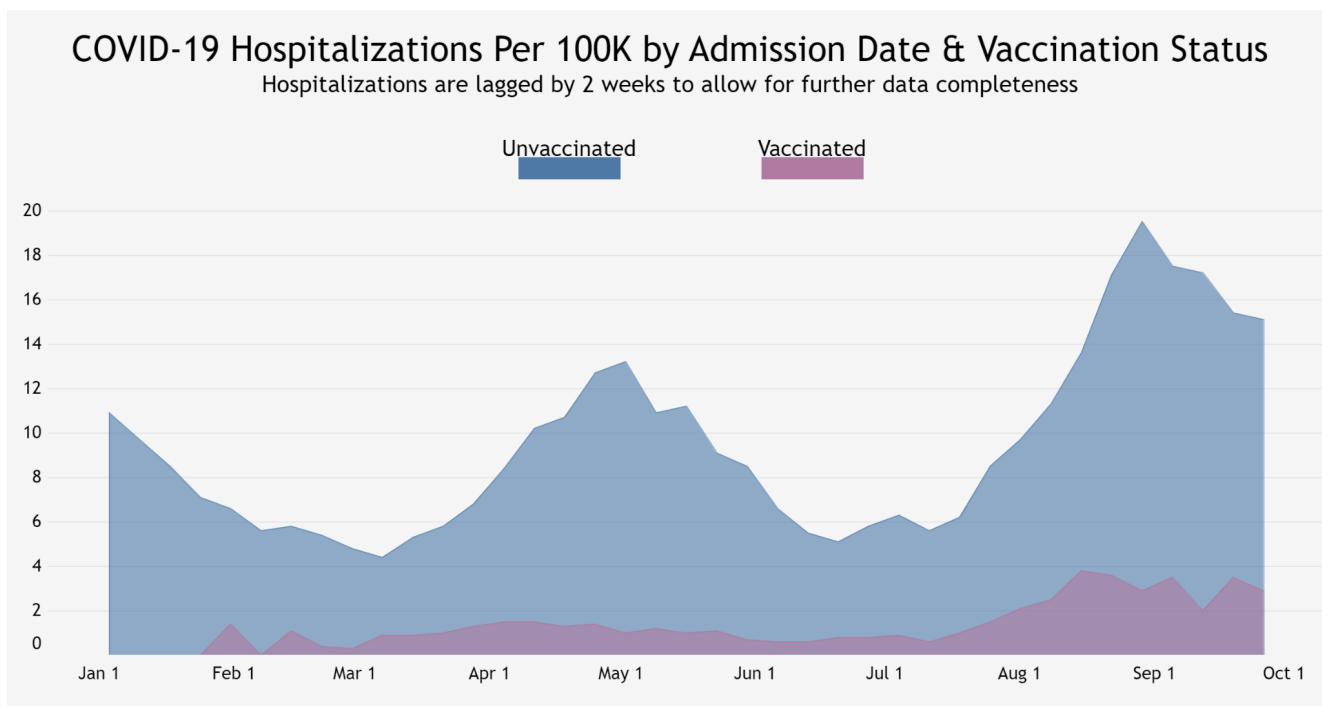
