

### 2023 Assistance Grant Funding Information

The Assistance Grants Program supports public water systems that are interested in committing to excellence, but lack the financial resources to do so. The assistance grants program provides financial assistance for systems that need help reaching or exceeding compliance requirements or addressing a water quality challenge. This program primarily funds infrastructure projects and requires systems to address operational and administrative improvements, such as emergency response plans, main break response procedures, and storage tank inspection plans. This is an effort to meet safe drinking water program goals and help water systems achieve these goals.

#### These grants are intended to:

- Help systems reach or maintain more consistent compliance with the Colorado Primary Drinking Water Regulations.
- Address a potential or existing water quality challenge.

Grants can be awarded up to \$25,000 with a total of \$150,000 to be awarded annually. Projects must be completed within the calendar year they are awarded. After the application period has closed, applications and referrals will be reviewed and ranked.

#### Projects will be ranked taking into account:

- Feasibility.
- Timeline (must be completed by December 2023).
- Impact.
- If the water system is located in a disproportionately impacted community.

In addition to these external applications, division personnel also refer projects to this program.

A division committee will evaluate top ranked systems will be evaluated by a division committee and finalists will be notified by **February 2023.** Grants through this program are subject to the availability of funding.

# CPDHE Assistance Grant Application 11/17/2022

The State is accepting applications for up to \$25,000 in funding for water quality projects that can be completed by the end of 2023. There is no match for this grant, but the application must be submitted by November 25<sup>th</sup> of this year.

We propose to apply for this grant to fund a tank mixer for our Middle Zone Tank.

We have issues with tank turnover during the warmer months that cause chlorine residuals to drop and disinfection byproducts to increase.

During recent training and networking, we discovered we were not the only community with this issue. Upon consulting PSI Technologies, the same company who we got our MicroClor (Chlorine generator) from, they suggested a submersible tank mixer. This is a special pump that sits on the bottom of the tank and creates a vortex that mixes the entire tank. The pump they haver suggested to uses 120v single phase power, which we already have at the tank.

The total cost of the pump, based on a quote I received in October of this year, is \$22,010. This includes the pump, an enclosure for the power, adaptability to SCADA if we ever find it necessary, and start up by the company. Alan Ducey quoted me an estimated \$1,000 to run a dedicated 20A circuit to the pump. We, the Town, would be tasked with completing the install of the pump, but believe there would not be any issues for us to accomplish this in house. We estimate our labor to be \$1,200, bringing the total cost of the project to an estimated \$24,210.

This grant is specifically for improving water quality and after previous conversations believe it would be in the best interest of the Town of Rangely to apply for the grant to acquire this piece of equipment.
