# **Ordinance 695 (2021)**

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING SOME NEW SECTIONS, WITHIN SECTION 9.04 OF THE RANGELY MUNICIPAL CODE AND PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Trustees of the Town of Rangely ("Council") determined to schedule a public hearing to obtain public input adding new definitions and sections within Section 9.04 of the Rangely Municipal Code ("Code"), thus adding regulations for Tobacco Products

**WHEREAS**, public hearings were held on June 8th, 2021 and July 13, 2021 by the Council at the Rangely Town Hall with public notice thereof having been given in the Rio Blanco Herald Times newspaper on June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2021 and July 8<sup>th</sup>, 2021; and

**WHEREAS**, effective December 20, 2019, the Federal minimum age for sale of tobacco products changed from 18 years of age to 21 years of age; after said date, it is and has been unlawful for a retailer to sell any tobacco product, including cigarettes, cigars, and e-cigarettes to anyone under 21 years of age. That Federal law does NOT include an exemption to purchase tobacco products for persons who were 18 years old or older as of December 2019 or for active U.S. military personnel under 21 years of age; and

WHEREAS, use of all tobacco products including vaping devices on school property is prohibited under Colorado's Tobacco Free Schools law. The Council is informed that the Rangely's RE-4 school district will ensure that its policy meets or exceeds the standards of Colorado's Tobacco Free School law by implementing best practices for communicating tobacco policies and procedures, implementing best practices for resources to assess tobacco use behavior around the school, and have appropriate signage located on school property and strategies for enforcement.

**WHEREAS**, the Council has duly considered the input given at such hearings by the public; and,

**WHEREAS**, based on the testimony received, the advice of Town staff and the experience of members of the Council,

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF RANGELY, COLORADO:

It is for the health, welfare and safety of the best interests of the citizens, especially the minor citizens, of the Town that new sections within Section 9.04 of the Code be added as set forth below, and the BOARD FINDS AND DETERMINES that the facts contained herein justify and mandate that such changes be made to the applicable provisions of the Code, and that the regulation of tobacco products is necessary for the public health, welfare and safety, to wit:

# 1. New definitions are hereby adopted, and added to Section 9.04.020, to wit:

#### Section 9.04.020 Definitions

8. The term "tobacco product" means any device or product containing tobacco leaf which is intended to be, or is used to be, introduced into any portion of a user's body by smoking, inhaling, chewing or placement into the mouth or otherwise being introduced into a human's body including, but not limited to, cigars, cigarettes, cigarillos, chewing tobacco, pipe tobacco, roll-your-own tobacco, snus, bidi, snuff, tobacco-containing shisha, dissolvable tobacco products. "Tobacco product" shall also include electronic smoking devices that deliver substances to the user by turning liquid into vapor that is inhaled. "Electronic smoking devices" include but are not limited to electronic cigarettes, cigars, cigarillos, pipes and hookahs. "Tobacco product" does not include any product that the Food and Drug Administration of the United States Department of Health and Human Services has approved as a tobacco use cessation product.

#### 9. "Smoking" means, but is not limited to:

- i. The placement, carrying or possession of a device or instrument in one's mouth for the purpose of inhaling or exhaling smoke or vapor or blowing smoke or vapor rings.
- ii. The placing of a lighted smoking instrument in an ashtray or other receptacle or in such a way as to allow any smoke or vapor containing tobacco to diffuse into the air.
- iii. The possession, carrying or placement of a "smoking instrument in a person's hand or any appendage or device by which tobacco smoke or tobacco vapor will diffuse into the air or directly into the body of a person; and
- iv. The inhaling or exhaling of smoke or vapor from a lighted smoking instrument.
- 10. *Self-service display* means any retail tobacco product display to which customers have direct physical access, including cigarette and tobacco product vending machines.

- 11. *Minimum legal sales age* means the age of a person to whom a retailer or other person can sell, barter or transfer possession of a tobacco product to, and is abbreviated below as *MLSA*.
- 12. *Vending machine* means any mechanical, electric or electronic self-service device which, upon insertion of money, tokens or other form of payment, dispenses a tobacco product.
- 13. *Smoking instrument* means a device or instrument of any kind which can be used to deliver substances, including but not limited to, nicotine, tobacco, marijuana, or any other substance, or a combination thereof, to the person using or in close proximity to the device or instrument. *Smoking instrument* includes, but is not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, cigarillos, pipes and hookahs, and electronic smoking devices.
- 14. *Lighted* or *lit* means to combust or burn, vaporize, or otherwise cause to be converted from a liquid or a solid into a vapor or a gas, such as by use of fire, a flame, battery, electricity or focused light.
- 15. *Electronic smoking device* means an electric or battery-operated device which can be used to deliver substances, including but not limited to nicotine, tobacco, or marijuana, to the person using such device. An *electronic smoking device* includes, without limitation, electronic cigarettes, electronic cigars, electronic cigarillos, electronic pipes, and electronic hookahs. An electronic smoking device includes any component, part or accessory of such device whether or not sold separately, regardless of the content of nicotine or the content of any other substance intended to be vaporized for human inhalation during the use of the device.

# 2. A new section 9.120, titled *Offenses Relating to Tobacco Products* is hereby adopted, to read:

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 21 (for purposes of this ordinance, a "minor") to knowingly to possess, consume or use tobacco products either by smoking, ingesting, absorbing, or chewing. It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly furnish to any minor, by gift, sale or any other means any tobacco product. It shall be unlawful for any business proprietor, manager or other person in charge or control of a retail business of any kind to engage, employ or permit any person to provide, sale or any other means a tobacco product to a minor.
- B. The Rangely Police Department may after referral and investigation issue a municipal court summons and complaint to the violator if the violator, on a first contact, refuses to immediately cease and desist from: the use or possession of a tobacco product, or the use or possession of a smoking instrument or the possession or use of an electronic smoking device; and on a second or subsequent contact, possesses or uses a tobacco product or a smoking instrument or an electronic smoking device. . .

- C. For each such summons and complaint, the Council recommends that the municipal court impose useful public or community service as a sentencing option upon conviction. Council also recommends that parents and guardians of minors are required to be present with the minor at all stages and appearances in the municipal court.
- D. The Council further recommends that the Police Chief, the Town Attorney and the Municipal Judge, either with or separate from any local public health agency, refer all appropriate minor violators to such sentencing alternatives as "Tobacco Education Second Chance." See, <a href="https://coloradohub.org/resources/tobacco-education-program-second-chance/">https://coloradohub.org/resources/tobacco-education-program-second-chance/</a>. "Second Chance" is a free, on-line interactive and self-directed alternative for teens who violate tobacco policy at school or in the community and for teens who are experimenting with tobacco but have not violated any policy or law.

# 3. The following provisions are also hereby adopted:

- A. If any part of this ordinance is invalidated for any reason, it shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.
- B. This ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days after publication following final passage.

#### -End of text of Ordinance-

The said Board of Trustees, also known as the Town Council, hereby deems it appropriate to publish the title of this ordinance which summarizes the ordinance and hereby gives notice that the entire text is available for public inspection and acquisition in the office of the Town Clerk.

• Plant production has increased to 808,000 per day, which is normal for this time of year. Turbidity is increasing as expected with Spring runoff. There haven't been any issues so far with it.

- Snowpack conditions for the Yampa-White basin is at 45% of normal. When looking at comparable
  years, 2021 snowpack conditions are trending very similarly to 2018. We will continue to monitor
  snowpack and flow rates and will keep administration updated.
- On May 25<sup>th</sup>, Timber Line came to Rangely and replaced 2 of our obsolete radios. We still have 6 radios left to replace and will be doing the replacements in phases. As we pull old radios out, this gives us extra parts to work with for the other radios until the new ones are installed. This is important because parts for the old radios are no longer manufactured.
- We received word that we were awarded the DOLA grant for the La Mesa water line project and proceeded with purchasing all the pipe and various fittings, per the drawings that the engineer had come up with. Had we waited, the price of the fittings was expected to go up 23% on June 1<sup>st</sup>, according to Grand Junction Pipe.
- We are still in the process of working on the operator agreement with Chevron and have submitted more comments for Dan to review.
- We opened our second Middle Zone tank that is offline to see what it would take to get the tank back online if drought conditions made it necessary. The tank is in very good condition and is completely dried out, so no issues with mold or stagnant water. If we decide to bring the tank back online, we will follow standard tank start-up procedures and make sure the tank is disinfected and clean enough for potable use.
- While in the process of digging up a water service line for repair, we struck an unmarked oil line. Chevron responded promptly and took full responsibility for the line not being marked. They helped excavate where the water line was broken and did all the backfilling for us.
- Monthly compliance reports were sent to state with no compliance violations for this reporting period.
- We received our new electric pallet jack so that we could haul salt from the Cleary building all the way to the plant and it works great.
- We also received our new strap-on flow meter that we can use to verify the flows of our current magmeters or the flow of water through any pipe we need. This will aid us in figuring out sources of water loss.

#### Wastewater Plant:

- Pond turnover at the Wastewater Treatment plant has resulted in increased odors. This is expected each year, and the odor will continue to get better with time.
- We repaired a leak on our ductile airline at the Wastewater treatment plant. As soon as that one was fixed, we discovered another couple of air leaks along with a water line leak. The water line and one of the air leaks have been repaired, we still have two more air leaks to repair.
- Still continuing maintenance of the UV system to ensure we meet disinfection compliance.
- Completed state reports and sent with no violations on compliance for this month.
- We were able to replace a circulation pump on the south side of Pond B. We still have the north pump on Pond B to replace.
- This month we will need to continue regular maintenance on some of our equipment including cleaning the check valves on our lift pumps and replacing blower motors on our floating aerators.

- Mike and Emily attended a pre-workshop for Diversion Structure Assessment in Meeker. They will try to attend Diversion Structure Assessments on the White River in the future as well.

- Department still working on a facility assessment and inventory program which also be part of the Utilities Mater Plan.
- Attended meetings with PAC and Douglas Creek Advisory Board and Water Conservancy.
- Repaired raw water line leaks at the community garden.

#### **B. General Project Description:**

The Colorado Tourism Office (CTO), a division of the Office of Economic Development and International Trade (hereinafter called OEDIT or State) is entering into this Purchase Order with the Town of Rangely (hereinafter called "Vendor") to operate, manage and maintain a State of Colorado Welcome Center, referred to as "CWC" and offer customer service and Colorado travel information to visitors.

#### C. Purpose of a CWC:

CWCs are situated along major highways or other locations that attract a high concentration of travelers. The purpose of a CWC is to provide visitors with statewide travel information aimed at inspiring travelers to increase their spending in Colorado whether by extending their stay, visiting more attractions or returning for a future visit. ### **E. Benefits to CWC Operators:**

The main benefits local partners derive from designation as a CWC include credibility for travelers; inclusion on highly visible, state-sponsored messaging platforms; and access to state-sponsored resources, as follows:

- CWCs qualify for official Colorado Department of Transportation welcome center signage along major highways.
- CWCs are listed as traveler resources on Colorado.com, in the Colorado Official State Vacation Guide and on the official state map.
- CTO provides a system-wide training for Managers twice a year.
- CTO provides training and materials on an ongoing basis to ensure that CWC Managers and personnel stay abreast of state regulations and requirements and traveler opportunities across the state.

- Summer Hours: Memorial Day weekend in May through Labor Day weekend in September -Monday through Saturday from 8:00 AM until 5:00 PM. Sunday from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM.
- Winter Hours: Tuesday after Labor Day through November 30- Monday through Saturday from 9:00 AM until 5:00 PM. Sunday from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM. November 1, closed on Sunday through April 30.

The CWC shall be operated during the above dates and times, unless circumstances do not allow and prior notice is provided to the Director, or the Director's designee, and agreed upon. Major holiday closures will be Frances Xavier Cabrini Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, President's Day and Easter.

- The Vendor operated CWC shall provide travelers with maps and directions, brochures
  and up-to-date information on events, attractions, activities, and accommodations
  throughout the state without bias to any community, organization, association or
  business. This is not intended to prohibit the Vendor operated CWC from providing
  information on local and regional events, attractions, activities, and accommodations.
- The Vendor operated CWC shall comply with the CWC Brochure Distribution Guidelines by maintaining a minimum of 90 percent of the required brochures listed in the policy as "Required Brochures for Display at a Colorado Welcome Center."
- The Vendor operated CWC shall accommodate CTO messaging and materials designed to support collection of Welcome Center visitor data and share CTO-sponsored materials and programs with travelers.
- The Vendor operated CWC shall not allow advertising and displays, signs or posters, solicitations or sales transactions that are not tourism-related or would not be of interest to travelers on those portions of the premises used for CWC operations.
- The Vendor operated CWC shall comply with the Manager's Operations Manual and other written policies governing CWC practices provided by CTO. However, State policies and procedures relating to CWC staff, contractors or volunteers will not supersede or alter Vendor's policies and procedures. CWC staff and volunteers shall follow Vendor's employment and personnel policies.
- The Vendor operated CWC will be maintained in good condition. The premises, including the restrooms, shall be kept accessible and clean.

### **B.** Evaluation

The Vendor operated CWC will be evaluated annually to determine level of compliance with requirements for CWCs.

### C. Insurance

Vendor shall provide all liability insurance for the premises and workers compensation insurance for the employees of the WC and shall provide the State with a certificate of insurance prior to the PO start date of 7/1/2021. Vendor shall obtain and maintain insurance as specified at all times during the term of this PO.

#### IV. Personnel:

### A. Staffing:

The Vendor shall recruit and select CWC Manager and staff. The CWC Manager shall recruit and select any volunteer staff necessary to operate the Welcome Center. The Vendor operated CWC shall ensure a minimum of two trained volunteers or staff that are on duty during hours of operation. Although the Vendor is encouraged to consult with the CWC Director, or designee, regarding hiring and key personnel decisions, the authority to hire and fire CWC staff rests with the Vendor. The CTO may raise concerns to the Vendor about unsatisfactory performance of CWC Manager or other staff.

The Vendor shall immediately notify the CWC Director, or designee, if the CWC Manager ceases to serve or is incapacitated for a period of longer than 2 months.

### **B.** Training & Events:

The Manager shall attend and participate in all monthly CWC Managers' Meetings, Welcome Center trainings and the annual Colorado Governor's Tourism Conference unless prior notice is given to the CWC Director, or designee, and agreed upon.

The CWC Manager shall provide the CWC training program to all new personnel. This training program and material will be provided by the CTO and includes, but is not limited to an overview of all official state travel resources including the Official State Vacation Guide, <a href="https://www.Colorado.com">www.Colorado.com</a>, and the Official State Map.

The CWC Manager shall provide ongoing training for CWC personnel to share CTO updates. The Manager also shall provide opportunities for representatives of Colorado destinations and attractions to make educational presentations to CWC personnel.

The CWC Manager may, but is not required to, host an informational study tour allowing CWC personnel to visit a designated travel region each year. The number and duration of study tours may vary at the discretion of the CWC Manager, the County, and the CWC Director, or designee.

### C. State Provided Email Address and Business Cards:

• The State agrees to offer the Vendor the use of a Colorado.com email address, during the term of this Purchase Order. The use of this email shall be at no cost to the Vendor, and shall comply with the following:

- Vendor's use of the Colorado.com email address is subject to public release through the Colorado Open Records Act (CORA) as required under §24-106-107, C.R.S.
- Upon acceptance of this Purchase Order, Vendor agrees to adhere to the attached Acceptable Use Policy, Exhibit B, as an authorized user of the Colorado.com email address.
- The State agrees to offer the Vendor business cards for use during the term of this Purchase Order. The State agrees to offer these business cards to the Vendor at no cost. The Vendor may use their own business cards at their expense, but they may not include the Colorado Tourism Office Logo image.

### V. Reporting:

The CWC Manager shall submit to the CWC Director, or designee, the monthly visitation (domestic and foreign) reports, origination reports, visitor logs, updates on activities with staff and volunteers and any special promotion inventory on the first day of each month, unless other arrangements are specified in advance.

The Vendor shall submit quarterly and year-end reports of the usage of contractual funding, using the form provided as Attachment A, to track the use of CTO funds as well as other contributions toward operation of the CWC. This information includes operational and maintenance costs, number of paid staff and salary expenditures, number of volunteer travel counselors on staff, and contact information for the owner of the property.

The County shall submit quarterly reports as follows:

- Reporting for July 1 Sept. 30 is due on October 31, 2021;
- Reporting for October 1 December 31 is due on January 31, 2022;
- Reporting for January 1 March 31 is due on April 30, 2022

Reporting for the full year – for July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022 – is due on July 31, 2022.

### VI. Budget & Payments:

### A. Budget:

The Maximum Amount payable under this Purchase Order is \$70,860.00 to the Vendor for the operation of the CWC.

**B.** Management Fee: In consideration of the services provided by the Vendor as set forth herein, The State of Colorado agrees to pay the Management Fee above to the Vendor in 12 equal monthly payments per month, which amount shall be pro-rated for any partial month of service. Vendor shall submit an invoice for the payment of the monthly Management Fee within 5 business days after the end of the month. Payments hereunder shall be made per the terms of the Purchase Order, with a properly and accurately submitted invoice. All payments will be made by Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT). The Vendor shall provide all EFT information.

**C. Payments:** Payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions as set forth above. The total amount payable under the terms and conditions of this Purchase Order shall not exceed \$70,860.00. Any amounts in excess of this total, if agreed to by both parties, must be provided by a properly executed amendment to this Purchase Order.

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## 1. Title: Acceptable Use of State Data and IT Resources (also referred to as the Acceptable Use Policy or AUP)

### 2. Purpose

The use of information technology resources, including access to email, the internet, state applications and systems, etc. is a privilege that enables state employees to perform their jobs efficiently, and it is incumbent upon each employee to ensure that these resources are used in a safe manner. The purpose of this policy is to provide state employees and all other authorized Users with guidance on the proper use of the state's technology resources, including state resources that can be accessed from users' personal devices.

This policy supports the State of Colorado State Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) in achieving the goals of the Colorado Information Security Act (C.R.S. §



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24-37.5, Part 4). This policy is supported by the Statement of Compliance that employees and other authorized Users must acknowledge and agree to before gaining access to state IT resources.

This policy should be viewed as a set of minimum requirements that must be adhered to in order to establish a consistent baseline of acceptable use of state IT resources. Depending on the needs of the agency Business Owner, the type and categorization of the data being processed, stored, or transmitted by the system, federal or state statutory or regulatory requirements, or any other concerns or requirements, there may (and likely will) be more stringent requirements for acceptable use of some state IT resources. Any additional requirements will be identified in any agency, system, or application specific documentation or policy. Any additional requirements that are stricter than the requirements of this policy will supersede and will establish the minimum requirements that must be adhered to in connection with the applicable state IT resources.

This policy is issued pursuant to the State of Colorado Information Security Policies (CISP) created to support the State of Colorado Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) in achieving the requirements of the Colorado Information Security Act (C.R.S. § 24-37.5-401 et seq.). For the Consolidated Agencies, the Governor's Office of Information Technology (OIT) maintains an Information Security Program to control risks associated with access, use, storage, sharing, or destruction of sensitive information. OIT documents the program details in the Enterprise Cyber Security Plan (ECSP), and sets forth security policy for the Consolidated Agencies in the OIT Information Security Policies. Non-Consolidated Agencies shall maintain an Agency Cyber Security Plan (ACSP), and implement the Colorado Information Security Policies for the same purpose.

### 3. Policy

- 3.1 All state IT resources, information, and data are the sole property of the state of Colorado, and applicable statutes, policies, and guidelines govern their use. All Users must use state IT resources in an acceptable manner as defined within this policy.
- 3.2 Any Public Agency has the right to monitor and/or investigate any User's state network, internet, system, or email accounts, and their usage for legitimate business reasons, whether on a state-issued or personal device authorized to



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connect to the state network. This monitoring and/or investigation can include all IT resource performance, employee performance, compliance with this policy, compliance with any applicable laws and industry regulations, and any reasonable suspicion of activities that may violate this policy.

3.3 Exceptions to this policy may be requested via the <u>Acceptable Use Policy - Exception Request form</u>.

### 4. Organizations Affected

This policy applies to all Public Agencies ("Agency") as defined in C.R.S. § 24-37.5-402(9).

This policy also applies to any entity providing information technology (IT) as defined in C.R.S § 24-37.5-102(2) or any IT related products, goods, equipment, hardware, supplies, software, services, or any other IT related resource to any Agency. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, the State Chief Information Security Officer (CISO), as set forth in C.R.S. § 24-37.5-403(1) shall, in the CISO's sole discretion, determine the application of this policy to any Entity or Agency.

This policy is not intended to govern the use of state IT resources made available for public use (e.g., public Wi-Fi in state facilities by members of the public); rather, such public use will be governed by any terms and conditions of access acknowledged and agreed to by users upon first accessing public-facing state IT resources.

### 6. Definitions



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For the purposes of this document, refer to C.R.S. § 24-37.5-102 and the CISP Information Security Glossary for any terms not specifically defined herein. The glossary is posted in the same location as the Colorado Information Security Policies - <a href="http://oit.state.co.us/ois/policies">http://oit.state.co.us/ois/policies</a>.

- 6.1 **Annual Acceptance:** This policy must be accepted by Users at the start of employment and no less than annually thereafter.
- 6.2 CISO: Chief Information Security Officer. Unless otherwise referenced, CISO refers to the State CISO as defined in C.R.S. § 24.37.5-404(4).
- 6.3 **CJIS**: Refers to Criminal Justice Information System data, including fingerprints, criminal background checks, etc.
- 6.4 **Consolidated Agencies:** Refers to those Agencies whose IT functions were consolidated under OIT pursuant to SB 08-155 and defined in C.R.S. 24-37.5-102(4).
- 6.5 FTI: Federal Tax Information. FTI includes federal tax returns or return information received directly from the IRS or obtained through an authorized secondary source, such as Social Security Administration (SSA), Federal Office of Child Support Enforcement (OCSE), Bureau of the Fiscal Service (BFS), or the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), or another entity acting on behalf of the IRS pursuant to an IRC 6103(p)(2)(B) Agreement. See IRS Publication 1075. FTI may include any personal information on a tax return, including the taxpayer's name, identification number, Social Security number, tax balance due, etc. FTI does not include information received from the taxpayer or generated by the data owner unless the information is co-mingled in a system containing FTI.
- 6.6 IT Resource (Device): Any computing device or resource, including, but not limited to, desktop computers, laptops, tablets, (e.g. iPad, Windows, Chromebook, etc.), smartphones (e.g., iPhone, Android, etc.), removable media that has the ability to access IT resources, including IT networks, and accounts that allow access to IT resources (e.g., Gmail, Salesforce).
- 6.7 **Non-Consolidated Agencies:** Refers to those Agencies whose IT functions were not consolidated under OIT and are not defined as a state agency under C.R.S. § 24-37.5-102(4). (See Consolidated Agencies above)
- 6.8 PHI: Protected Health Information as defined in 45 CFR § 160.103.7.8
- 6.9 **PII:** Personally Identifiable Information is any information that could potentially identify a specific individual, including the individual's first and last names, address, zip code, date of birth, Social Security number, spouse's and/or



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children's names, etc. In Colorado, PII is defined in C.R.S. §24-73-101, and includes financial information, social security number, personal identification number, password, pass code, official state or government-issued driver's license or identification card number, government passport number; and biometric data.

- 6.10 **Remote Access Tools:** Software that enables authorized users to securely access the state network. For purposes of this Policy, the tools are referred to as VPN.
- 6.11 Removable Media: Any type of storage device that can be removed from an IT resource to which it has been connected or attached, including but not limited to any USB drive (also called flash drive or thumb drive), hard drive, personal music player, disc drive, DVD, CD, camera, mobile phone, memory card, etc.
- 6.12 **Sensitive Information:** Any information where the loss, misuse, unauthorized access to or modification of which could adversely affect the interest or the conduct of information systems, or the privacy to which individuals are entitled. Sensitive information includes, but is not limited to, FTI, PII, PHI, CJIS, etc. See TS-Data Cat-001 <u>Data Security Categorization</u>.
- 6.13 **User:** For this policy, the term "User" shall include all state of Colorado employees, temporary workers, contractors, interns, volunteers, third-party vendors, and any others who have been granted access to non-public state IT Resources.
- 6.14 **Virtual Private Network (VPN):** Provides a direct, secure, and encrypted connection between your device and certain state IT resources that are not otherwise accessible when working remotely. VPN protects information from being intercepted from untrusted public networks.
- 6.15 **Web-based Resources:** Any resource that is publicly accessible via the internet for the purpose of conducting official state business. These applications may include, but are not limited to, the following:
  - Google Suite of Apps
  - Kronos
  - Online training
  - CA Service Desk or other ticketing system
  - Video collaboration and conferencing tools

### 7. Data Protection and Handling

7.1 Users shall not send or disseminate PII or other sensitive, regulated, or



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- confidential information in an unencrypted form over a state network or the internet.
- 7.2 Users may learn, or have access to, sensitive information concerning state and/or agency business, Colorado's residents, and employee data. It is the responsibility of Users to maintain the confidentiality of all state information. Users must take precautions to protect against the unauthorized or careless disclosure of this information at all times and should never share account credentials.
- 7.3 Devices storing Sensitive Information, even for a limited duration, must be encrypted in compliance with all applicable Colorado Information Security Policies and OIT Technical Standards.
- 7.4 Sensitive Information shall not be downloaded or stored on personal IT devices.

  Data stored on a state-owned or state-managed remote storage location or
  cloud service may be accessed on an approved personal device provided no
  data is downloaded to local storage on the personal device.

### 8. Acceptable Use

- 8.1 Internet services approved for a User should be limited to what is necessary for their job function. The purpose of internet access from state resources is to conduct state business; examples include but are not limited to:
  - Communication with business associates
  - Research
  - Online training
  - Obtaining relevant news/information
  - Professional networking
  - Listening to applicable legislative hearings or committee meetings for the purposes of fulfilling my agency or work group's mission.
- 8.2 Users should have no expectation of privacy. All electronic communications (including, but not limited to, email, text messages, instant messages, and any other forms of electronic communication) sent to and from state-assigned accounts are the property of the State.
  - 8.2.1 Acceptable activities using state communications accounts include but are not limited to:
    - Communicating with fellow employees, business partners, and clients within the context of an individual's assigned job duties and responsibilities.



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- Acquiring or sharing information necessary or related to the performance of an individual's assigned duties.
- Participating in educational or professional development activities.
- 8.2.2 Electronic communications pertaining to state business are subject to the Colorado Open Records Act (CORA), C.R.S. §24-72-201, et seq. Any communication made using personal IT resources is also subject to CORA to the extent it pertains to state business. Any User using a personal IT resource, including a smartphone, for state business is responsible for searching the personal device or account in response to any request for records under CORA.

### 9. Social Media

- 9.1 Users shall not use state IT resources provided for State business to make postings on personal social networking sites (e.g., Facebook, Twitter), personal blog sites, newsgroups, chat rooms, other social media, or discussion boards. As members of the public, Users may engage in personal activities on state IT resources made available for public use (e.g., public Wi-Fi in State facilities).
- 9.2 Agencies may have their own policies regarding social media use. Users shall comply with any applicable agency social media policy or procedures in addition to this policy.

### 10. License Agreements/Copyright Compliance

State IT resources must be used in accordance with the terms of software license agreements or other copyright restrictions in order to protect the State, its officials, and Users from possible legal action. Users may not access or store any copyright material using any State IT Resource without an appropriate license. Examples of unacceptable use of State IT resources would be installing pirated or unlicensed software, or engaging in peer-to-peer file sharing to acquire unlicensed media or other copyrighted files. Users should direct any questions or concerns regarding copyright or license issues to the User's appointing authority or supervisor.

### 11. Remote Access and Authentication

- 11.1—Unless specifically prohibited by a policy of OIT or any Public Agency, Users may be granted Remote Access to state IT resources for the purposes of accomplishing state work duties.
- 11.2 Users may Remotely Access a State IT Resource via a personal device to the



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extent permitted by the Remote Authentication configuration for that State IT Resource.

- 11.2.1 Users should only Remotely Access a State IT Resource for a discrete state business purpose, and then only for the shortest possible duration.
- 11.2.2 Users must take reasonable effort to ensure that any device used to connect to a State IT Resource is secured consistent with best practices for use of personal computing devices, including without limitation:
  - The device is free from malware infection
  - The device is protected by strong authentication, such as a password or PIN
  - The device is set to automatically receive security and other operating system updates from the device or software manufacturer
  - Additional best practices for Securing Your Computer found on the US-CERT's Publications webpage (accessible at this <u>link</u>).
- 11.3 Users must request written approval from the CISO or designee (via OIT CISO@state.co.us) to Remotely Access a State IT Resource from outside the United States. The CISO or designee may approve or deny such request within their sole discretion.
- 11.4 Employees must safeguard IT Resources used for state business from loss or theft.
- 11.5 Devices used for state business, including personal IT resources with Remote Access, that are lost or stolen must be reported immediately to the employee's manager and the OIT Service Desk, or as may otherwise be provided in any applicable policy of a Non-Consolidated Agency.
- 11.6 The State reserves the right to access and wipe any device, including any personal IT Resource used for state business, to ensure the protection of state data.
- 12. Remote Access & Personal Devices Consolidated Agencies Only

The following apply to Consolidated Agencies in addition to the requirements of section 11 above.

12.1 Remote Access - VPN. Not every user within the Consolidated Agencies requires VPN to work remotely. VPN is only required for users who need to remotely access state computing resources that are accessible only on the Trusted State Private Network and not available via published Web-based Resources.



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- VPN is only allowed when using state-issued computing devices.
- VPN is not allowed for use on personal devices. Emergency and temporary access may be granted by the State Chief Information Security Officer under specific, limited circumstances.
- 12.2 Remote Access Web-based Resources. When using a personal device to conduct state business, you must comply with the guidelines found within this AUP. It is incumbent upon you to read the AUP in its entirety to ensure you understand your responsibilities. Additionally, before using a personal device you must ensure that all of your software (i.e., operating system, antivirus and security software) is up-to-date and it is:
  - free from malware infection and running anti-malware protective software,
  - protected by strong authentication, such as a password or PIN, and
  - set to automatically receive security and operating system updates.
  - See the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Additional best practices for <u>Securing Your Computer</u> for additional best practices.
- 12.3 Work Product. It is not permissible to save work-related products of any type (e.g., documents, spreadsheets, etc.) to your personal device or removable media.

### 12. Personal Use of State IT Resources

- 12.1 Limited personal use of state IT resources, including telecommunication services, is permitted but not encouraged due to the proliferation of cybersecurity threats. This use should only occur when access complies with the requirements of this policy, does not interfere with work and individual duties, does not increase costs to the State, or create undue security risks. Such limited personal access and use is a privilege, not a right, and can be revoked at any time. Examples of limited personal use include but are not limited to:
  - Reading the headlines of reputable news sites during a lunch break;
  - Signing up for white papers or webinars on work-related topics using state email;
  - Incidental use of email for communication of personal plans or appointments.
- 12.2 Any personal use of State IT Resources is at the User's own risk. The State is not responsible or liable for any personal data that is transmitted over State IT



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resources. Personal communications made using State IT Resources may be subject to monitoring or investigation by the State and require disclosure under CORA.

### 13. Unacceptable and Prohibited Use of State IT Resources

- 13.1 The use of state IT resources for any commercial purpose or personal financial gain is strictly prohibited.
- 13.2 State IT resources may not be used at any time for participation in political activities.
- 13.3 Users are discouraged from using state IT resources to conduct personal business, such as making online purchases, banking, etc. as this can expose both the state and individual to unacceptable security risk. If in doubt, check with an immediate supervisor for permission.
- 13.4 Users may not forward their state email to a personal email account.
- 13.5 Use of state IT resources shall not be used in a manner that jeopardizes the confidentiality, integrity or availability of the IT Resources.
- 13.6 Users may not use State IT Resources, including public-facing state IT Resources, to send, receive, or access any content or communication of a defamatory, discriminatory, harassing or pornographic nature. Prohibited content shall include anything that is offensive based on a person's disability, race, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, religion, age, national origin, or ancestry, or that would otherwise contribute to an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work environment.
- 13.7 Users may not use State IT Resources, including public-facing state IT Resources, to engage in any conduct in violation of any local, state, or federal law or regulation, any of the <u>State of Colorado Universal Policies</u>, or any of the Colorado Information Security Policies. Prohibited conduct shall include the use of disparaging, abusive, profane, or offensive language and any illegal activities, including piracy, cracking, extortion, blackmail, copyright infringement, and unauthorized access to any computer system, network, or account.
- 13.8 Users may not take any unauthorized, deliberate action which damages, disrupts a state IT resource, alters, or degrades its normal performance, reduces the established security controls, or causes it to malfunction.
- 13.9 Unauthorized access to any State IT Resource is prohibited. Users may not intentionally use state IT resources to access, or attempt to access, any



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machine, IT resource, network, file or information that they are not authorized to access by virtue of the privileges associated with their User account. Such unauthorized access may constitute a violation of law and be subject to penalty under law, as well as disciplinary action up to and including termination.

- 13.10 Users may not download or install software on state IT resources without express permission of the User's appointing authority. All unauthorized software will be removed upon discovery. Examples of unauthorized software include, but are not limited to:
  - Games (other than those that come standard with the device)
  - Unauthorized shareware or freeware
  - Unauthorized hacking or security software
  - Software intended for personal use Registry cleaners
  - Peer-to-peer software
  - Personal firewalls
  - Malware, including but not limited to: viruses, Trojans, spyware or adware
- 13.11 Users' internet usage must comply with all federal and state of Colorado laws, all state of Colorado policies, and any policies issued by the User's agency.
  13.12 If usage of a State IT Resource is deemed unacceptable or is impeding the User's ability to perform their job duties, the User's supervisor or appointing authority, and OIT for Consolidated Agencies, has the right to restrict access and/or initiate corrective or disciplinary action as appropriate.

### 14. User Privacy and Right to Monitor and Investigate

- 14.1 Files or data that are created, entered, stored, or downloaded to a state IT resource, and transmissions sent or received by Users, including those sent or received by email, instant messaging, voicemail, text message, or over the internet can be accessed, monitored and investigated by authorized personnel at OIT at any time, for any reason without the prior consent of the User. As such, Users shall have no expectation of privacy when using a state IT resource or accessing state data.
- 14.2 All state records stored on an IT resource, with minimal exception, are subject to the Colorado Open Records Act (CORA), C.R.S. §24-72-201 to 206.
- 14.3 OIT management, technical administrators, and security personnel periodically monitor the usage of state IT resources to ensure they are operated in a manner that is consistent with the requirements of this policy.
- 14.4 Information created, collected, generated, or stored by a User on either



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state-owned computing devices or personal computing devices that are authorized to connect to state IT resources may be disclosed to State Risk Management, State Human Resources, and law enforcement if criminal activity is suspected. This disclosure will be at the discretion of OIT, the User's appointing authority, and State Human Resources, as applicable, during or after the course of investigating suspected acceptable use violations.

### 15. Incident Reporting

- 15.1 For Consolidated Agencies, OIT has created a cybersecurity incident response plan that supports its service delivery to its customer agencies. The success of this incident response plan is dependent on Users quickly reporting suspected issues to the OIT Service Desk. The incident response plan is described in greater detail in IR- Incident Response CISP-008.
  - 15.1.1 If suspicious activity occurs, Users are required to report the incident to the <u>OIT Service Desk</u> and to their immediate supervisor. Examples of suspicious activity include, but are not limited to:
    - Unusual pop-ups and/or virus warnings
    - Suspicious callers attempting to obtain unauthorized information such as a User's password or other personal information
    - Suspected attempts to gain unauthorized access to an IT resource by unauthorized parties
    - Witnessing suspected unauthorized use of removable media
  - 15.1.2 OIT makes every attempt to block access to websites that violate local, state, or federal laws and regulations, this policy, or any agency policies. Due to ever evolving technology, the state cannot be aware of every possible website that contains inappropriate content and Users are encouraged to report these websites to the OIT Service Desk for blocking.
- 15.2 Non-Consolidated Agencies must have an incident reporting and response plan consistent with this Policy and all other CISPs.

### 16. Compliance

- 16.1 Failure of state employees or other Users to comply with this policy may result in, as applicable:
  - loss of or reduced access to state IT resources,
  - corrective action and/or disciplinary action up to and including



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termination of employment, and/or

- referral to law enforcement.
- 16.2 A violation of this policy by temporary workers, interns, volunteers, contractors, or vendors may result in termination of their contract or assignment with the state of Colorado.
- 16.3 Non-Consolidated Agencies must have appropriate policies and procedures to ensure compliance with this Policy and all other CISPs.

### 17. Expiration

This policy remains in effect until superseded or rescinded by the State Chief Information Security Officer.

### Appendix A: Examples of Unacceptable Use

In addition to the examples contained within this policy, unacceptable behavior also includes, but is not limited to:

- Sharing account credentials with anyone.
- Sending harassing, threatening, racist, hate-oriented or defamatory materials, or



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visiting sites that host such material.

- Engaging in any unauthorized fundraising.
- Proselytizing for religious or political purposes.
- Copying state information (or other information intended for official business) to removable media or sending it to an unauthorized address.
- Posting to blog sites, unauthorized newsgroups, chat rooms, social media, or discussion boards.
- Engaging in political campaign activities during work hours.
  - Technical Assistance Employee Participation in Political Activities
- Purposefully altering, disabling, or circumventing security features and mechanisms on state IT resources and networks.
- Purposefully tampering with or attempting to turn off monitoring software on an IT resource.
- Attaching unauthorized personal computers, laptops, handheld computers, smartphones, modems, etc. to a state IT resource or network.
- Engaging in illegal file sharing (e.g., software, software keys, passwords, files, music, videos, etc.) or using peer-to-peer software without appropriate authorization and in the performance of the job duties.
- Creating and/or knowingly sending spam, chain letters, phishing emails or hoaxes.
- Sending sensitive or confidential information to outside parties.
- Creating and/or knowingly send malicious code.
- Engaging in phishing or other fraudulent activities.
- Intercepting data intended for others on the network.
- Using spoofing techniques to disguise email addresses or other network activity.
- Accessing any state IT resource for which the User is not approved.
- Using network resources to store personal data or files.
- Attaching unauthorized wireless access points to a state network.
- Streaming unauthorized audio or video files.
- Sending or downloading copyrighted material, including music media, video files, images, etc. unless authorized by the copyright holder.

# Town of Rangely Resolution 2021 –04

### A RESOLUTION OPPOSING 2022 BALLOT INITIATIVE 16

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2021, a citizen's initiative entitled "Protect Animals from Unnecessary Suffering and Exploitation" (PAUSE) was approved by the Title Board of the Colorado Secretary of State for petition to the November 2022 General Election as Initiative 16; and

**WHEREAS**, the initiative will have grave and far-reaching impacts on the state of Colorado and its voters and the initiative will broadly redefine animal sexual abuse in a manner that will criminalize many common and necessary, proper and veterinary-approved animal husbandry practices and methods of care for pet, livestock, zoo, and other animals in Colorado; and

WHEREAS, the initiative will additionally require tremendous delays, in most cases years, prior to the humane harvesting of livestock, these delays (of up to one-quarter of an animal's statutorily defined natural lifespan) will greatly increase the costs to livestock producers by forcing the continuation of feeding this livestock past their prime harvest age at which will cause meat of lower quality to be sold to the consumer at much higher purchase prices, and potentially create an export only model for Colorado livestock, severely injuring the supporting industries and their employees in the State of Colorado; and

**WHEREAS**, any forced exportation of ready to process livestock products creates a domino effect on the collapse of the support industries and opens the state to a higher dependency on imports, further injuring the Colorado producer's ability to positively impact the revenue generated from the agricultural community in Colorado.

**WHEREAS**, these increases in livestock production costs will put Colorado producers at an unfair disadvantage to surrounding states' and countries' that compete with Colorado producers for the same markets causing many to severely reduce or go out of business; and

**WHEREAS**, the initiative will reduce the standard of care provided by veterinarians reducing the quality of life of those animals and the criminalization of approved practices will prevent veterinarians from performing procedures that help reduce the unsafe feral pet population and will restrict the ability of pet owners to properly care for their companion animals; and

**WHEREAS**, the initiative will criminalize practices that allow for the care and reproduction of livestock animals, now to include fish as livestock, and the food products they produce including beef, pork, dairy products, etc. as well as potentially eliminating the Colorado Endangered Fish Recovery Program; and

**WHEREAS**, the initiative will drive up carbon emissions and reduce the sustainability of food production and reduce consumer food choice, availability, and increase grocery prices; and

**WHEREAS**, the initiative will unnecessarily limit everyday events and activities that include animals, such as dog and cat shows, dog agility competitions, trail rides, horse shows, rodeos, etc. and

**WHEREAS**, the initiative will have tremendous economic consequences for cities and counties across the state of Colorado.

**WHEREAS**, the governor's spokeswoman Shelby Wieman said Governor Polis "agrees with farmers and ranchers that the PAUSE ballot initiative would hurt Colorado and destroy jobs, and he opposes it".

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of the Town of Rangely that:

- 1. The Board opposes Initiative 16 and urges the Governor of Colorado and Commissioner of the Colorado Department of Agriculture to continue to do the same.
- 2. The Town of Rangely urges all citizens to decline to sign any petition that supports placing Initiative 16 (PAUSE) on the November 2022 ballot.
- 3. All people that care about the well-being of animals be they livestock, fish, pets, service animals, endangered species or other act to defeat this measure if it does make the November 2022 ballot.

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




EPI summary: This past week we experienced additional cases in both Meeker and Rangely with an increase in hospitalization rate. Although not confirmed as of 6/1/21, we do have a suspected case of the variant Indian strain in Rio Blanco County.

# Immunizations 6.1.21

We are working with local hospitals and the state immunization database to collect the most accurate, real time vaccine statistics for our county. Some numbers are estimates based on reporting delays. Current stats:

- Total vaccinations through RBC public health: 2990 ( ~1647 first dose, ~1343 booster )
- Total vaccinations reported by healthcare facilities: 568 (306 first dose, 262 booster)
- Total patients vaccinated with at least one dose in RBC (reported as of 6.1.21): 1953
- Approximate percent of eligible population vaccinated with at least one dose (now 12 and up): 34.3%





### **Joint Chiefs Landscape Restoration Partnership Act of 2021**

### **Section-by-Section**

**Section 1: Title** 

### **Section 2: Program Details**

- a. <u>Definitions:</u> Defines a number of terms important to the program, including defining "Chiefs" as the Chief of the Forest Service and the Chief of the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS); "eligible activities" as activities that reduce the risk of wildfire, protect water quality and supply, and improve wildlife habitat for at-risk species; and "wildland-urban interface" as defined in the Healthy Forests Restoration Act of 2003.
- b. <u>Establishment and Administration:</u> Requires the Secretary to establish the Joint Chiefs' Landscape Restoration Partnership program to improve the health and resilience of forest landscapes across National Forest System land and Tribal, state, and private land. Directs USDA to implement eligible activities on National Forest System land and work with landowners and/or producers to implement eligible activities on their lands.
- c. <u>Selection of Eligible Activities</u>: Requires the appropriate Regional Forester and State Conservationist to jointly submit proposals to the Chiefs for consideration.
- d. Evaluation Criteria: Requires the Chiefs to prioritize proposals that: reduce wildfire risk in municipal watersheds or the wildland-urban interface; are developed through a collaborative process; increase forest workforce capacity or forest business; leverage existing authorities and non-federal funding sources; provide measurable outcomes; and support state and regional priorities.
- e. <u>Outreach</u>: Requires the Secretary to provide information about the program on USDA websites and share information with Tribes, states, local governments, and landowners, including project solicitation and selection criteria.
- f. <u>Exclusions</u>: Clarifies that activities cannot be carried out in wilderness areas, inventoried roadless areas, on federal land where vegetation removal is prohibited, or where such activities are inconsistent with the applicable land and resource management plan.
- g. <u>Accountability</u>: Requires the Secretary to provide Congress a report on the program with additional recommendations to improve project delivery, and requires annual reports to Congress describing the status and outcomes of funded projects.
- h. <u>Funding</u>: Authorizes \$90 million annually through FY2030. Of these funds, at least 40 percent are available to the NRCS and at least 40 percent are available to the U.S. Forest Service. The USFS or NRCS can use the remaining 20 percent in a flexible manner, including for technical assistance, project planning, and local capacity building.

# Treasury releases additional ARP guidance for non-entitlement municipalities

Yesterday, the U.S. Treasury issued additional American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act guidance for the **Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds program**. The new guidance is intended to assist states with their distribution of funds to non-entitlement units of local government (NEUs), which are local governments typically serving a population under 50,000. The guidance and supporting material and information for NEUs can be found **here**.

In Colorado, the following municipalities are receiving ARP funds directly from Treasury – Centennial, Colorado Springs, Commerce City, Denver, Fort Collins, Grand Junction, Greeley, Lakewood, Longmont, Loveland, Parker, Pueblo, Thornton, and Westminster. Each of the other 258 municipalities in Colorado are classified as NEUs and will receive their funds from the state.

The **guidance** sets forth a process for states to verify NEUs and a step-by-step guide to inform the state on how to calculate and distribute the \$265 million in funds for NEUs. State governments, like Colorado, that have made a request for their own funds from Treasury and will be considered by Treasury to have requested funding for their NEUs as well. The first tranche of payments for NEUs should come to Colorado within several days.

It appears clear that NEUs will be required to request their respective allocations from the state and to submit specified information along with any information required by the state. The League anticipates that the Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) will handle the requests and distribution, and more information will be available soon on **this page**. CML advises members to review Treasury's checklist for municipalities in preparation for requesting payment from the state. Ensuring all the checklist items are completed will prevent delays in receipt of local funding allocations.

As a reminder, municipalities will receive half of their allocation this year and the second half approximately one year later. While the municipalities above that are direct recipients will have to file quarterly reports with Treasury, all of the non-entitlement municipalities will only be required to file an annual report that will also be directly with Treasury. All funds must be encumbered by the end of 2024 and exhausted by the end of 2026.

Finally, Colorado Counties, Inc. (CCI) and CML collaborated with DOLA and Gov. Polis's office to reestablish and repurpose the Local Government Coronavirus Relief Fund

Committee that assisted with CARES funding distribution logistics. Additional members have been added from local, state, and federal partners, and the committee will serve more as a working group to advise and assist local governments in effort to coordinate with each other and the state and federal governments to leverage and maximize the use of ARP funds. This coordination is also critical, as **Gov. Polis and legislative leaders announced yesterday** that about \$717 million of the state's \$3.8 billion in ARP funding will be set aside for an interim process to identify recovery and relief plans, much of which could focus on programs to assist local governments with water, wastewater, and broadband infrastructure costs, as well as other unmet needs. 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# CORONAVIRUS LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUND: GUIDANCE ON DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS TO NON-ENTITLEMENT UNITS OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT

#### U.S. DEPARTMENT OF THE TREASURY

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) appropriates \$19.53 billion to States for distribution to tens of thousands of "non-entitlement units of local government" (NEUs). ARPA directs the Department of the Treasury (Treasury) to make payments to each State for distribution to NEUs within the State. Treasury is providing the following guidance to assist States with their distribution of these funds to NEUs.

#### **Statutory Overview**

Sections 602 and 603 of the Social Security Act (the Act), as added by section 9901 of ARPA, establish the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund (State Fiscal Recovery Fund) and Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (Local Fiscal Recovery Fund), respectively, which provide significant funding to help states and localities address the economic and health consequences of the pandemic. Sections 602 and 603 of the Act provide for Treasury to make payments directly to States, territories, Tribal governments, and various local governments, including counties and cities designated as metropolitan cities. In recognition of the significant differences across States in the ways that local governments are organized and the extent of the services they provide to their populations, Congress also provided for Treasury to make payments to the States to allocate and make this funding available to smaller units of general local governments, NEUs.

A State is required to allocate and distribute the Local Fiscal Recovery Fund payment received from Treasury to each NEU in the State an amount that bears the same proportion to the amount of such payment as the population of the NEU bears to the total population of all the NEUs in the State.<sup>1</sup> However, the total amount to be distributed to an NEU may not exceed the amount equal to 75 percent of its most recent budget as of January 27, 2020.<sup>2</sup> Each State has 30 days to distribute these funds to NEUs, but Treasury may provide extensions of this deadline, as outlined below.

Treasury will make payments to States from the Local Fiscal Recovery Fund for distribution to NEUs in two tranches, with the Second Tranche payment to be made no earlier than 12 months after the date on which the First Tranche payment is paid to the State.<sup>3</sup>

#### Prior to Distribution

Before distributing funds to NEUs, States will need to request payment from Treasury, identify eligible NEUs within their State, calculate allocations, and collect certain documents from NEUs.

• Request the State's payment from Treasury. A State's submission of a request for payment from the State Fiscal Recovery Fund under section 602 of the Act will suffice for Treasury to initiate payment to the State from the Local Fiscal Recovery Fund for distribution to the State's NEUs. Payment of this amount will be made to the bank account designated by the State with respect to the State Fiscal Recovery Fund.

Aggregate NEU allocations to each State can be found on treasury.gov/SLFRP, along with the allocation methodology.

- <u>Identify eligible NEUs</u>. States should identify eligible NEUs by following these guidelines:
  - o Treasury has provided on its website a list with names and population estimates for each local government (List), categorized by State, based on data from the Bureau of the Census (Census Bureau) with some clarifications by Treasury.<sup>4</sup>
  - o The List includes both "incorporated places" and "minor civil divisions" (MCDs).
  - o All incorporated places on the List are eligible for payment.
  - o MCDs serve as the primary subdivisions of a county in some States and are commonly known as towns (in New England, New York, and Wisconsin), townships, and districts. In 12 States—referred to by the Census Bureau as "strong-MCD" States—these MCDs generally perform a wide set of general purpose local government functions. In eight other States—referred to by the Census Bureau as "weak-MCD" States—the MCDs generally play less of a governmental role but are still active governmental units. The other 30 States do not have governmentally functioning MCDs.
  - O States should approach the eligibility of their incorporated places and MCDs on the List as follows:
    - For the 12 strong-MCD States<sup>6</sup> and 30 States without governmentally functioning MCDs, a State should consider all the local governments on the List as eligible for payment.
    - For the eight weak-MCD States,<sup>7</sup> a State should consider all incorporated places on the List as eligible for payment.

In order to determine the eligibility of its MCDs, the State should undertake a facts-and-circumstances test to determine whether the MCD has the legal and operational capacity to accept ARPA funds and provides a broad range of services that would constitute eligible uses under ARPA. States should consider specific authorities and the size and composition of the budgets of these MCDs in making

this determination. MCDs in these States that lack the capacity or do not provide the broad range of services that would constitute eligible uses under ARPA should not be eligible for a NEU distribution. States may categorically exclude all weak MCDs if none of them provide the relevant types of services. Treasury will defer to the States' determination in this regard given their superior understanding of the particularities of their local governments' authorities and operations.

Before making initial distributions to NEUs, each weak-MCD State should identify on the State's website the names of MCDs that the State removed, accompanied by an explanation of the State's determination.

As stated above, strong-MCD States and States without governmentally functioning MCDs should not undergo this facts-and-circumstance test. In addition, weak-MCD States should not undergo a facts-and-circumstances test with respect to their incorporated places.

#### Calculate initial allocations.

As stated above, ARPA requires States' allocations to NEUs to be based on the proportion
of the population in the NEU as a share of the total population of all NEUs in the State.
This requirement can be represented by the following formula:

 $\frac{\textit{Total population of the NEU}}{\textit{Total population of all eligible NEUs}} \times \textit{Aggregate state NEU payment}$ 

- o States must use the population counts in the List, since these reflect the most recent data available from the Census Bureau.<sup>8</sup>
- o In some States, the boundaries of some NEUs overlap with or encompass other NEUs within the State, typically resulting in overlapping populations between the larger "parent" NEU and the subsidiary NEU. An example is a township that encompasses a city. States have the discretion to divide the population of overlapping NEUs in a number of ways for the purpose of the allocation, but Treasury suggests consideration of the following:
  - The default approach is for the subsidiary NEU's population to be subtracted from the larger "parent" NEU for purposes of this allocation. For ease of use, the

List reflects this default approach by providing the net population of the "parent" NEU excluding the population of all its subsidiary components.<sup>10</sup>

- Alternatively, States may decide to allocate a different split of the overlapping population between NEUs (e.g., 50-50 split for two overlapping NEUs). This decision should be made based on a facts-and-circumstances test that considers the extent to which the NEU provides services that would constitute eligible uses under the Local Fiscal Recovery Fund, including considering the size and composition of the NEU's budget. States should not allocate the entire overlapping population to the larger "parent" NEU.
- Double counting when determining NEU allocations is inadvisable.
- <u>Establish a process for NEUs to submit requests for payment</u>. States should establish a process that will allow NEUs to provide information and documentation necessary to disburse funds to NEUs. The information and documentation collected by the State prior to initiating payment must include the following:
  - o Local government name, Entity's Taxpayer Identification Number, DUNS number, and
  - o Authorized representative name, title, and email
  - o Contact person name, title, phone, and email
  - o Financial institution information (e.g., routing and account number, financial institution name and contact information)
  - Total NEU budget (defined as the annual total operating budget, including general fund and other funds, in effect as of January 27, 2020) or top-line expenditure total (in exceptional cases in which the NEU does not adopt a formal budget)
  - o Award terms and conditions agreement (as provided by Treasury to be signed)
  - Assurances of compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (as provided by Treasury to be signed)
- Receive requests for payment from NEUs. States should receive and process requests for distribution from NEUs that include the information and documentation indicated above. The State must confirm the NEU is not excluded or disqualified in compliance with 2 C.F.R. Part 180 and Treasury's implementing regulation at 31 C.F.R. Part 19. States should advise the NEU to retain a copy of its award agreements for upload with the NEU's first report to Treasury due October 31, 2021. Pursuant to 2 C.F.R. Part 25, States should advise the NEU to register in SAM.gov as soon as possible after receiving the award if the NEU is not already registered.

As part of this process, States should assign each NEU a unique "NEU Recipient Number" starting with the two letter State abbreviation followed by four numeric digits (e.g., AZ0231). States should advise the NEU to retain this NEU Recipient Number as an identifying number for the lifecycle of the program, including for reporting purposes.

- <u>Determine whether the "75 percent cap" applies</u>. Section 603(b)(2)(C)(iii) of the Act and the Interim Final Rule (IFR) provide that each NEU's total award (i.e., the total of distributions under both the First and Second Tranche) is capped at 75 percent of its annual total operating budget, including the general fund and other funds, in effect as of January 27, 2020 ("reference budget"). This involves several steps:
  - o Receive a budget total. As part of the request for payment, NEUs should submit a top-line total of the NEU's reference budget, certified by an authorized representative of the NEU. If a NEU does not adopt a formal budget, States should allow the NEU to certify its most recent annual total expenditures as of January 27, 2020 in lieu of the NEU's budget total. States should advise the NEU that these numbers may be verified against a copy of the appropriate budget documents submitted in the NEU's first report to Treasury.
  - Compare budget total with allocation. States should compare the total allocation to the NEU (across distributions under both the First and Second Tranches) against the NEU's reference budget.
  - o Return funds to Treasury, if applicable. If an NEU's total allocation is found to be more than 75 percent of the NEU's reference budget, the State must return the amount of the allocation in excess of the NEU's reference budget to Treasury. For example, if Town A is allocated \$100,000 and its reference budget totaled \$100,000, Town A would be entitled to a total distribution of \$75,000. ARPA requires the State to return \$25,000 in total to Treasury. Because payments are made by Treasury in two tranches and distributed by States in at least two distributions, the State would pay \$37,500 to Town A in the first distribution and the State would return \$12,500 to Treasury from the First Tranche amount. States should wait to return these funds to Treasury until after submitting their interim report due August 31, 2021 (detailed below).
- Process requests to transfer to the State. If a State receives notification from an NEU that it would like to decline its funding allocation and transfer funds to the State under Section 603(c)(4) of the Act, Treasury will consider this action as a cancellation of the award on the part of the eligible NEU and a modification of the award to the State. A State will not be required to transfer the amount of the payment to the NEU just for the NEU to transfer it back to the State. As part of this process, the NEU must provide a signed notice to the State, which the State must transmit to Treasury as part of its interim report due August 31, 2021 (or as part of a subsequent report, if applicable). If the NEU does not provide such notice, it will remain legally obligated under the award with respect to accounting for the uses of the funds and the reporting on such uses. Treasury will provide a standard notice form that will be required for this use.

Initial Distribution from First Tranche Amount

ARPA provides that States must make an initial distribution of funds to NEUs no later than 30 days after receiving a payment from Treasury for purpose of distribution to NEUs, unless the State requests and receives an extension. There are several steps that States should take in this phase:

• <u>Disburse the initial distribution of payments</u>. States should disburse the initial distribution of payments to the NEUs based on the allocations calculated in accordance with the process outlined above.

Under the IFR, States may not impose additional conditions or requirements on distributions to NEUs, beyond those permitted by ARPA, the IFR, and Treasury's guidance. For example, States may not impose stricter limitations than permitted by statute or Treasury regulations or guidance on an NEU's use of funds based on the NEU's proposed spending plan or other policies. States are also not permitted to offset any debt owed by the NEU against the NEU's distribution. Further, States may not provide funding to NEUs on a reimbursement basis.

- Record key information for reporting purposes. States should keep records of amounts allocated and, separately, amounts paid to each NEU. States will be required to submit information on their NEU disbursements with their interim report on the State Fiscal Recovery Fund program.
- Provide guidance to NEUs on their requirements to Treasury. States should direct NEUs to section 603 of the Act, the IFR, and this guidance, along with documents on the Treasury website, which include fact sheets and regularly updated FAQs.
- Apply for extensions, if necessary. If a State submits a certification in writing that it faces an excessive administrative burden in distributing funds to an NEU and requests an extension, in accordance with Section 603(b)(2)(C)(ii)(I) of the Act, Treasury will grant the State a 30-day extension of the deadline for distributing funds. Treasury may grant requests from States for further extensions. More information will be forthcoming on the extensions process.

#### Subsequent Distribution from First Tranche Amount

If a State has made reasonable efforts to contact an NEU that remains unresponsive (i.e., the NEU has neither requested funding nor declined its allocation and requested a transfer to the State), the State may issue a subsequent distribution of the funds that had been allocated to such non-responsive NEUs among the NEUs that have requested funding. If a State provides for such a subsequent distribution, the State should follow the steps below:

- <u>Gather required information.</u> States should identify the amount of remaining funds, which is the amounts allocated to NEUs that have been non-responsive ("remaining funds"). States should also identify NEUs that have received an initial distribution and whose initial allocation was below the 75 percent cap ("residual NEUs").
- <u>Allocate remaining funds</u>. States should allocate remaining funds among residual NEUs according to the formula below.

 $\frac{\textit{Total population of the residual NEU}}{\textit{Total population of all residual NEUs}} \times \textit{Remaining state aggregate NEU allocation}$ 

- Apply the 75 percent budget cap. Residual NEUs may only receive payments (across both First and Second Tranches, inclusive of distributions from remaining funds) up to the 75 percent budget cap, as described above. Amounts allocated to residual NEUs in excess of their 75 percent budget cap must be returned to Treasury. The excess amounts from the First Tranche should be returned in the post-distribution phase (as detailed below).
- <u>Disburse the subsequent distribution</u>. States should make the subsequent distribution to NEUs after allocating the remaining funds. As discussed above, States are prohibited from putting conditions or requirements on these distributions beyond those permitted by ARPA, the IFR, and Treasury's guidance.
- Record key information for reporting purposes. States should keep records of which residual
  NEUs received a subsequent allocation and distribution, and the amount of the subsequent
  allocation and distribution. States will be required to submit information on their subsequent
  distribution with their periodic reports to Treasury on the State Fiscal Recovery Fund program.

#### Post-Distribution

States will be asked to submit information on their allocations and distributions to NEUs with their periodic reports to Treasury under the State Fiscal Recovery Fund program, including the interim report on August 31, 2021. NEUs are also required to submit periodic reports to Treasury on their use of funds.

- Submit an interim report (August 2021). As part of the interim report required to be submitted to Treasury by August 31, 2021, which is a requirement under ARPA and the IFR, each State will be asked to provide an update on distributions to individual NEUs, including whether the NEU has (1) received funding; (2) declined funding and requested a transfer to the State under Section 603(c)(4) of the Act; and (3) not taken action on its funding. States should be prepared to report on their information, including the following:
  - o NEU name
  - o NEU DUNS number
  - o NEU address
  - o NEU email address
  - NEU Recipient Number (a unique identification code for each NEU assigned by the State to the NEU as part of the request for funding)
  - o Initial allocation and, if applicable, subsequent allocation to the NEU (before application of the 75 percent cap)
  - o Total NEU budget, defined as the annual total operating budget, including general fund and other funds, in effect as of January 27, 2020 (as submitted by the NEU to the State as part of the request for funding)
  - Amount of the initial and, if applicable, subsequent allocation above 75 percent of the NEU's reference budget which will be returned to Treasury
  - Payment amount(s)
  - Payment date(s)

For each eligible NEU that declined funding and requested a transfer to the State under Section 603(c)(4) of the Act, the State must also attach a form signed by the NEU, as detailed above.


Weak-MCD States should also list NEUs that the State deemed ineligible.

- <u>Submit a first quarterly report (October 2021)</u>. As part of the first quarterly report required to be submitted to Treasury by October 31, 2021, which is a requirement under ARPA and the IFR, each State will be asked to provide information on subsequent distributions to NEUs, if applicable.
- Return excess amounts (August-October 2021). States should arrange with Treasury to return excess amounts that were not distributed to the NEUs. Treasury will provide instructions to States on the return of funds.
- Provide guidance to NEUs on their reporting requirements to Treasury (October 2021). As prime recipients of a Federal award, NEUs are required to report to Treasury on the use of funds. States should ensure each NEU has the reporting guidance provided by Treasury, which is forthcoming. NEUs' first report is due to Treasury by October 31, 2021. In addition to other reporting requirements, NEUs will be asked to provide:
  - o NEU Recipient Number (a unique identification code for each NEU assigned by the State to the NEU as part of the request for funding)
  - o Copy of signed award terms and conditions agreement
  - o Copy of signed assurances of compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964
  - O Copy of actual budget documents validating the top-line budget total provided to the State as part of the request for funding
- Await Second Tranche amount (Spring-Summer 2022). Treasury will distribute the Second Tranche of payments to States for distribution to NEUs no earlier than 12 months after the date on which the First Tranche of payments is paid to the State. More information will be forthcoming closer to the date.

Additionally, States may be asked to facilitate Treasury's communications with NEUs, particularly distributing information on NEUs' use of funds and reporting requirements.
